#### Introduction

This manual contains detailed instructions and notes on the operation and use of this machine. For your safety and benefit, read this manual carefully before using the machine. Keep this manual in a handy place for quick reference.

#### Laser Safety:

This machine is considered a class 1 laser device, safe for office/EDP use. The machine contains eight AlGalnP laser diodes, 7-milliwatt, 648-660 nanometer wavelength for each emitter. Direct (or indirect reflected) eye contact with the laser beam might cause serious eye damage. Safety precautions and interlock mechanisms have been designed to prevent any possible laser beam exposure to the operator.

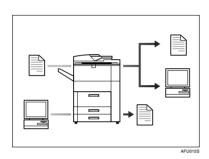

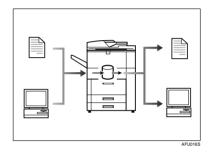
# Copier, Printer, and Scanner Functions



This machine provides copier, printer\* and scanner\* functions.

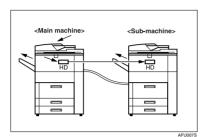
- You can make copies of originals.
   With a finisher\*, you can sort and staple copies. See Copy Reference.
- You can print documents created using applications. See Printer Reference.
- You can scan originals and send the scan file to a computer. See Scanner Reference.

# **Utilizing Stored Documents**



- You can store files of originals scanned by this machine, or files sent from other computers, onto the hard disk of the machine. You can print the stored documents, as well as change print settings and print multiple documents (Document Server). See p.37 "Using the Document Server".
- With DeskTopBinder Lite/Professional\*, you can search, check, print, and delete stored documents using your computer. You can also retrieve stored documents scanned in scanner mode. With File Format Converter\*, you can even download documents stored in copy and printer functions to your computer. See Network Guide and Scanner Reference.

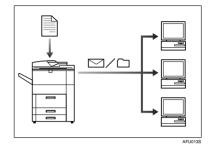
# **Connecting Two Machines for Copying**



You can connect two machines together with Copy Connector\*. When you set up a copy job on one machine (the main machine), data is transferred to the other (the sub-machine) so that copies can be made on both machines simultaneously (Connect Copy).

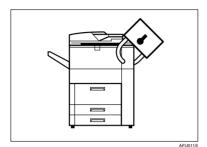
- You can complete large volume copy runs in shorter time. See Copy Reference.

# Using the Scanner in a Network Environment



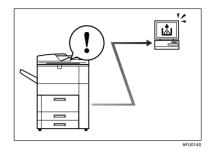

- If toner gets on your clothing, wash with cold water. Hot water will set the toner into the fabric and may make removing the stain impossible.

#### Duplex Priority

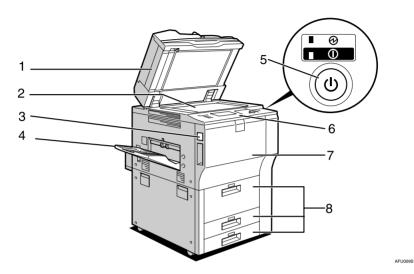

# **Guide To Components**



#### 1. Auto Document Feeder (ADF)

Load a stack of originals here. They will be fed automatically one by one.

## 2. Exposure glass

Place originals face down here.

# 3. Main power switch

If the machine does not operate after turning on the operation switch, check if the main power switch is turned on.

# 4. Copy tray (optional)

Copied or printed paper is delivered here.

## 5. Operation switch

Press this switch to turn the power on (the **On** indicator lights up). To turn the power off, press this switch again (the **On** indicator goes off).

# 6. Control panel

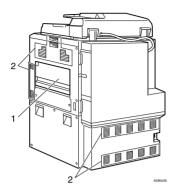

## 7. Front cover

Open to access the inside of the machine.

## 8. Paper tray (Tray 1-3)

Load paper here.

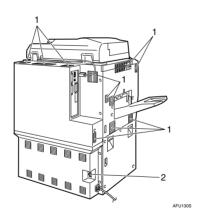


#### 1. Bypass tray

Use to print on OHP transparencies, label paper (adhesive labels), translucent paper, postcards and custom size paper.

#### 2. Ventilation holes

Prevent overheating. Do not obstruct the ventilation holes by placing an object near it or leaning things against it. If the machine overheats, a fault might occur.



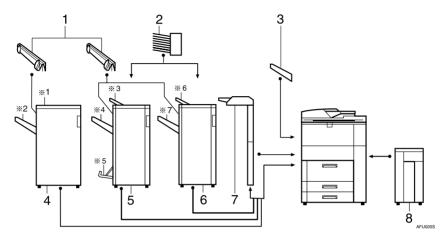

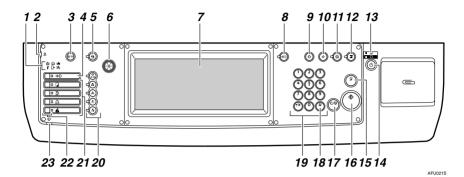

#### 6. Colour circle

Refer to this when adjusting colours. See "Colour Adjustment", Copy Reference.

#### 7. Display panel

Shows the operation status, error messages, and function menus.

## 8. [Check Modes] key

Press this key to check settings.

# 9. [Program] key (copier/scanner mode)

Press to register frequently used settings, or to recall registered settings.

# 10. [Clear Modes] key

Press to clear previously entered copy job settings.

# 11. [Energy Saver] key

Press to shift to and from Low Power mode.

# 12. [Interrupt] key (copier/scanner mode)

Press to make interrupt copies during copying or scanning. See "Interrupt Copy", Copy Reference.

#### 13. Main power indicator and On indicator

The main power indicator lights up when the main power switch is turned on.

The On indicator lights up when the power is turned on.

☐ Do not turn off the power while the On indicator is blinking. Doing so may damage the hard disk.

#### 14. Operation switch

Press this switch to turn the power on (the On indicator lights up). To turn the power off, press this switch again (the On indicator goes off).

## 15. [Sample Copy] key

Press to make a single set of copies or prints to check for print quality before making multiple sets.

## 16. [Start] key

Press to start copying, or to scan or print documents stored on the Document Server.

# 17. [Clear/Stop] key

Clear

Press to delete a number entered.

Stop

Press to stop a job in progress.

## 18. [#] key

Press to enter a numerical value.

## 19. Number keys

Use to enter the desired number of copies, or data for a selected function.

Switch keys depending on the type of original, or the copying purpose:

#### 22. Function Status indicator

# **Display Panel**

The display panel shows machine status, error messages and function menus.

The function items displayed serve as selector keys. You can select or specify an item by lightly pressing them.

When you select or specify an item on the display panel, it is highlighted like Keys appearing as OK cannot be used.

# **∰**Important

 $\ \square$  A force or impact of more than 30 N (about 3 kgf) will damage the display panel.

By default the copying screen is displayed when you turn the power on.



#### **Common Key Operations**

The following keys are common to all screens.

[OK]	Acknowledges a selected function or entered values, and then returns to the previous display
[Cancel]	Deletes a selected function or entered values, and then returns to the previous display
[▲Prev.], [▼Next]	Moves to the previous page or the next page when all functions cannot be displayed on one page.
[OK] [Yes]	Closes displayed messages.
[Clear]	Clears entered values and does not change the settings.
[Exit]	Returns to the previous display.

# When the Authentication Screen is displayed

When Basic Authentication, Windows Authentication, or LDAP Authentication is set, the authentication screen is displayed. Unless a valid user name and password are entered, operations are not possible with the machine.

- When User Code Authentication is set, the screen for entering a user code is displayed instead.
- 1 Press [Enter] for Login User Name.

When you press the **[Energy Saver]** key again, the machine returns to the ready condition. The machine uses less electricity in Energy Saver Mode.

#### Note

☐ You can change the amount of time the machine waits before switching to Energy Saver Mode after copying has finished or the last operation is performed. See p.62 "Energy Saver Timer".

## Auto Off

The machine automatically turns itself off when the job is finished, after a certain period of time has elapsed. This function is called "Auto Off".

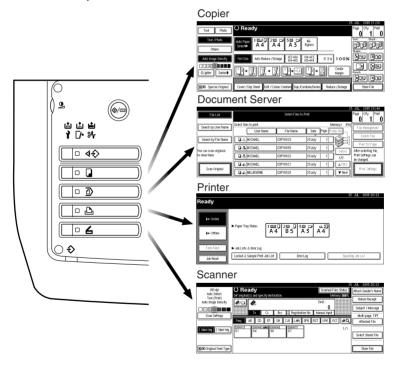

  - When the **Data In** indicator is on or blinking

## **Changing Modes**

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## System Reset

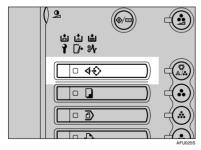

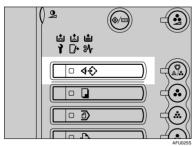

- While printing documents stored in the Document Server, the machine can receive print data.
- While executing print jobs, you can make operations for copying.

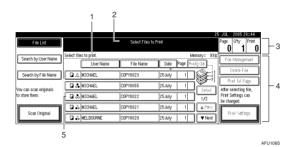

### **Storing Data**

#### File Name

Stored documents will automatically be named as "COPY0001", "COPY0002". You can change assigned file names.

#### User Name

You can register a user name to distinguish the user or user group that stored the documents. To register, you can either enter a name or use the one assigned to the user code.

#### Password

You can set a password for stored documents, and use it to prevent others printing them. When a password is set for the documents, mark appears next to the documents.

#### **∰**Important

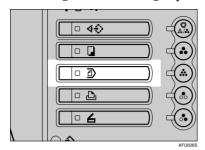
- Data stored in the machine might be lost if some kind of failure occurs. The supplier shall not be responsible for any damage that might result from the loss of data.
- Be careful not to let anyone know your password, especially when entering a password or recording it. Keep any record of your password in a secure place.

- ☐ Avoid using a single number or consecutive numbers for a password such as "0000" or "1234", since the numbers like this are easy to guess, so using them will not provide a worthwhile level of security.
- ☐ A document accessed with a correct password remains selected even after operations are complete, and it can be accessed by other users. To stop this, be sure to press the **[Clear Modes]** key to cancel the document selection.
- ☐ The user name used when adding a document to the Document Server is to identify the document creator and type. It is not to protect confidential documents from others.

#### Note

- ☐ Enter a four- to eight-digit password.
- ☐ By default, data stored in the Document Server is deleted after three days (72 hours). You can specify the time taken for the stored data to be deleted automatically. See p.69 "Auto Delete File".
- ☐ If you do not want stored data to be automatically deleted, select [No] in Auto Delete File before storing a document. If you select [Yes] later, data stored afterward will be automatically deleted.
- When the machine is printing a document stored using the copier function, wait until printing has finished before you store a document in the Document Server.
- ☐ Before scanning documents using the scanner function, make sure all other operations have finished.

- ☐ The message "♣Toner is almost empty." on the display shows a toner name and the telephone number for ordering.
- ☐ The consumption of toner depends on the humidity, temperature and printing factors such as image size, density, number of prints, paper size, and paper type. Moreover, to preserve print quality, this machine automatically performs periodic maintenance using the toner.
- ☐ Change all four colour-toner cartridges in the same way.

## **Dos And Don'ts**

#### ↑ WARNING:

 Keep the machine away from flammable liquids, gases, and aerosols. A fire or an electric shock might occur.

#### **A** CAUTION:

- Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet before you move the machine. While moving the machine, you should take care that the power cord will not be damaged under the machine.
- Do not turn off the main power switch while the On indicator is lit or blinking. This may cause damage to the hard disk or memory.
- Do not touch areas on or around the fusing unit. These areas get hot.
- After scanning originals continuously, the exposure glass may become warm—this is not a malfunction.
- If room temperature where the machine is located is higher than 30°C (86°F), do not copy in full colour continuously for more than two hours. If you do, white lines may appear on copies.
- When in standby mode, the machine becomes noisy when:
  - room temperature is higher than 32°C (89.6°F).
  - room temperature is 30°C (86°F), or higher and copying has been continuous.

This noise does not indicate malfunction. Do not turn off the machine.

- When you use this machine for a long time in a confined space without good ventilation, you may detect an odd smell. To keep the workplace comfortable, we recommend that you keep it well ventilated.
- The area around the ventilation hole may become warm. This is caused by exhaust air and is not a malfunction.
- Do not turn off the power when the machine is in operation.
- The machine might fail to produce good copy images if condensation forms inside due to rapid temperature change.
- Do not open the covers of the machine when it is in operation. If you do, misfeeds might occur.
- Do not move the machine when the power is on.
- If you operate the machine improperly or a failure occurs, settings might be lost. Be sure to make a note of your machine settings.
- The supplier shall not be liable for any loss or damage resulting from a failure of the machine, loss of settings, or use of the machine.

## **Saving Colour Copies**

- There is no difference between colour prints and colour copies in terms of fading. However, for long-term storage, make sure to store them in a binder away from direct sunlight.
- Toner may melt if a print and a half-dried print are put on top of each other.
- Toner may also melt when using solvent type adhesive agents for pasting prints.
- When folding prints, toner in the folds will come off.
- Toner may melt if it is placed on mats made of chlorinated plastic in locations of high temperature for long periods of time.
- Toner may melt if prints are placed in places of extremely high temperatures, such as near heaters.

## Where to Put Your Machine

#### **Machine Environment**

Your machine's location should be carefully chosen because environmental conditions greatly affect its performance.

#### **Optimum environmental conditions**

#### A CAUTION:

- Keep the machine away from humidity and dust. Otherwise a fire or an electric shock might occur.
- Do not place the machine on an unstable or tilted surface. If it topples over, an injury might occur.

#### **↑** CAUTION:

- If you use the machine in a confined space, make sure there is a continuous air turnover.
- Temperature: 10-32°C (50-89.6°F) (humidity to be 54% at 32°C, 89.6°F)
- Humidity: 15 80% (temperature to be 27°C, 80.6°F at 80%)
- A strong and level base.
- The machine must be level within 5 mm, 0.2" both front to rear and left to right.
- To avoid possible buildup of ozone, be sure to locate this machine in a large well ventilated room that has an air turnover of more than 30 m<sup>3</sup>/hr/person.

#### **Environments to avoid**

- Locations exposed to direct sunlight or strong light (more than 1,500 lux).
- Locations directly exposed to cool air from an air conditioner or heated air from a heater. (Sudden temperature changes might cause condensation within the machine.)
- Locations close to machines generating ammonia such as a diazo copy machine.
- Places where the machine might be subjected to frequent strong vibration.
- · Dusty areas.
- Areas with corrosive gases.

## Moving

#### **⚠** CAUTION:

 Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet before you move the machine. While moving the machine, you should take care that the power cord will not be damaged under the machine.

#### **∰**Important

- When moving the machine, the following precautions should always be followed:
  - Turn off the main power. See p.27 "Turning Off the Main Power".
  - Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet. When you do, grip the plug to avoid damaging the cord and causing fire or electric shock.

 Close all covers and trays including the front cover and bypass tray.

#### Limitation

- Carefully move the machine. If you do not, the machine might be damaged or a stored file might be deleted.
- ☐ Avoid any strong shock to the machine. This could damage the hard disk and cause stored files to be deleted. For precautionary reasons, files should be copied to another local computer.

- Do not damage, break or make any modifications to the power cord. Do not place heavy objects on it. Do not pull it hard nor bend it more than necessary. These actions could cause an electric shock or fire.

 Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet before you move the machine. While moving the machine, you should take care that the power cord will not be damaged under the machine.

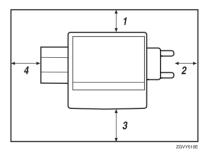

• With a type ② envelope, as shown below, fold the flap and load the envelope with the fold of the flap against the side guide and the flap underneath.



- Depending on the envelope type, specify appropriate print image rotation with the printer driver. For a type ① or ② envelope, specify 180 degrees; for a type ④, 90 degrees or 270 degrees.
- Check there is no air in the envelopes before loading.
- To get better print quality, it is recommended that you set the right, left, top, and bottom print margin, to at least 15 mm (0.6") each.
- You cannot print envelopes with duplex function.
- Load only one size and type of envelope at a time.
- Before loading envelopes, flatten leading edges (the side going into the machine) by pressing a pencil or ruler across them.
- Before loading envelopes, check they are rectangular in shape.
