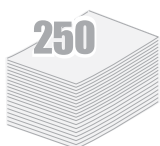
Special Features

Your new printer is equipped with special features that improve the print quality, giving you a competitive edge. You can:



Print with excellent quality and high speed

- You can print at up to **1200 dpi** effective output. See page 4.8.
- Your printer prints up to **22 pages-per-minute (Letter size)**, up to **20 pages-per-minute (A4 size)**.



Handle paper flexibly

- A 50-sheet **Multi-Purpose Tray** supports letterhead, envelopes, labels, transparencies, custom-sized materials, postcards, and heavy paper.
- **Standard 250-sheet input tray (Tray1)** and **optional 250-sheet input tray (Tray2)** supports all standard sizes of paper.
- Two output tray; select either **the top output (face-down)** or **the rear output tray (face-up)** for the most convenient access.
- **Straight-through paper path** capability from the Multi-Purpose Tray to the rear output tray.



Create professional documents

- You can customise your documents using **Watermarks**, such as "Confidential". See page 4.21.
- Print **Posters**. The text and pictures of each page of your document are magnified and printed across the selected sheet of paper. After the document has printed, trim off the white edges of each sheet. Tape the sheets together to form a poster. See page 4.16.

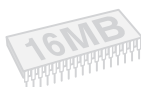

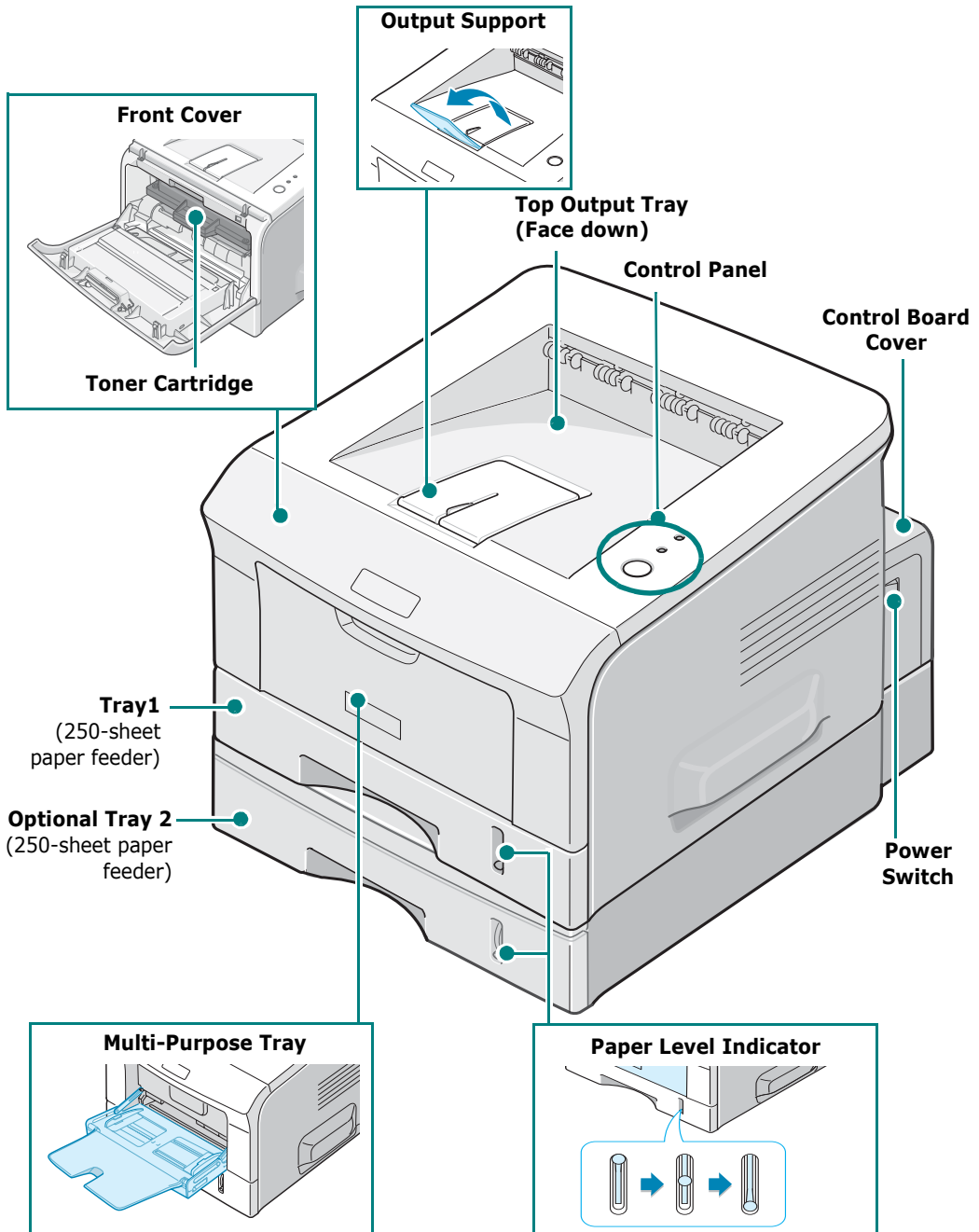

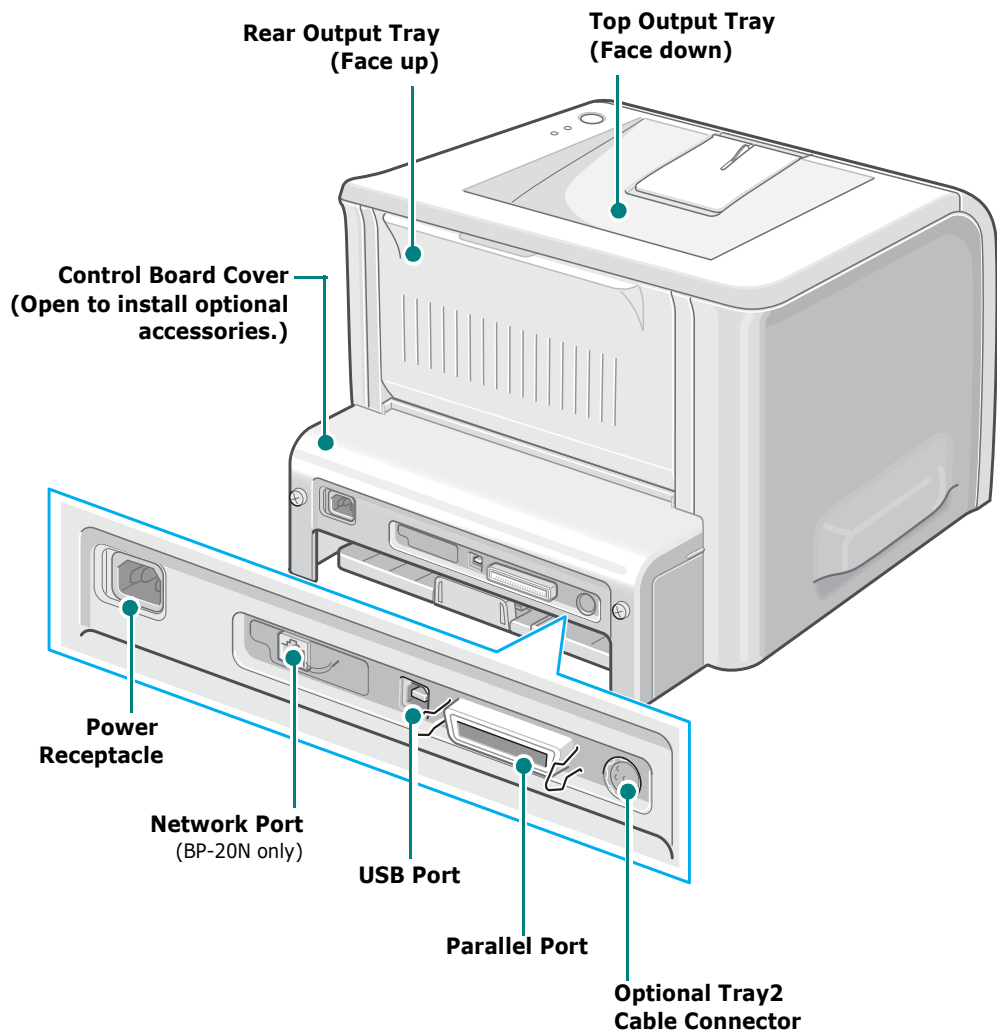

Front View



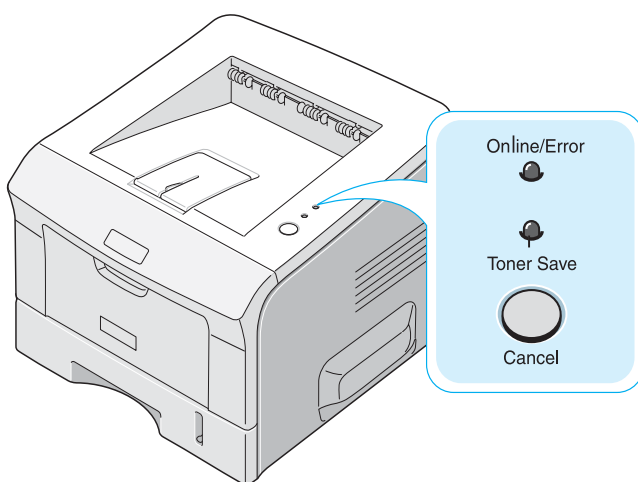







Understanding the Control Panel



Online/Error and Toner Save LEDs

LED	Description
	If the Online/Error lights green, the printer is ready to print.
	If the Online/Error lights red, the printer is experiencing an error, such as jammed paper, no paper, open cover, or uninstalled toner cartridge. See "Troubleshooting Error Messages" on page 6.21.
	If you press the Cancel button while the printer is receiving data, the Online/Error LED blinks red to cancel printing.
	In Manual Feed mode, if there is no paper in the Multi-purpose tray, the Online/Error LED blinks red. Load paper into the Multi-purpose tray and the LED stops blinking.
	If the printer is receiving data, the Online/Error LED slowly blinks green. If the printer is printing the received data, the Online/Error LED blinks green fast.
	If the toner cartridge is near the end of its life, the Online/Error LED lights orange.
	If the toner cartridge is empty, the Online/Error LED blinks orange.
	If the installed toner cartridge is not designed for your printer, the Online/Error LED blinks orange and red alternately.

LED	Description
	<p>If you press the Cancel button for 0.5 second in Ready mode, this LED lights and the Toner Save mode is enabled.</p> <p>If you press this button once again, this LED turns off and the Toner Save mode is disabled.</p>
	<p>If the Online/Error and Toner Save LEDs blink, your system has some problem. To solve the problem, see "Troubleshooting Error Messages" on page 6.21.</p>

Cancel button

Function	Description
Printing demo page	In Ready mode, press and hold this button for about 2 seconds until all LEDs blink slowly, and release.
Printing configuration sheets	In Ready mode, press and hold this button for about 6 seconds until all LEDs blink fast, and release. If your printer has a network card, the network configuration sheet prints out with a printer configuration sheet.
Network card Default Setting (When you use the Network card)	In Ready mode, press and hold this button for about 20 seconds until all LEDs blink slowly, and release. This item restores the factory default of the network configuration. This setting will only take effect after you have reset the printer.
Manual Feeding	Press this button each time you load paper in the Multi-purpose tray, when you have selected Manual Feed for Source from your software application. For detailed information, see "Using the Manual Feed Mode" on page 3.12.
Cleaning inside printer	In Ready mode, press and hold this button for about 10 seconds until all LEDs turn on, and release. After cleaning the printer, one "cleaning sheet" (see page 5.7) is printed.

Function	Description
Canceling print job	Press this button during printing. The Online/Error LED blinks while the print job is cleared from both the printer and the computer, and then the printer returns to Ready mode. This may take some time depending on the size of the print job.
Toner Save mode on/off	In Ready mode, press this button to turn the Toner Save mode on or off. For detailed information, see "Using the Toner Save Mode" on page 4.11.






Unpacking

- 1 Remove the Printer and all accessories from the packing carton. Make sure that the printer has been packed with the following items:

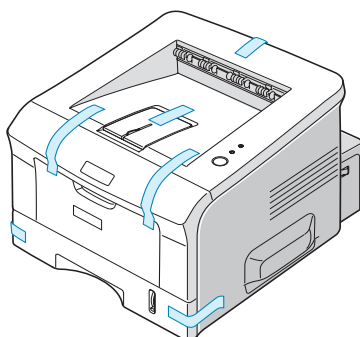
 Toner Cartridge	 Power Cord
 CD-ROM	 Safety Information Quick Install Guide



NOTES:

- If any items are missing or damaged, notify your dealer immediately.
- **Components may differ from one country to another.**
- The CD-ROM contains the printer driver, the User's Guide, and the Adobe Acrobat Reader programme.

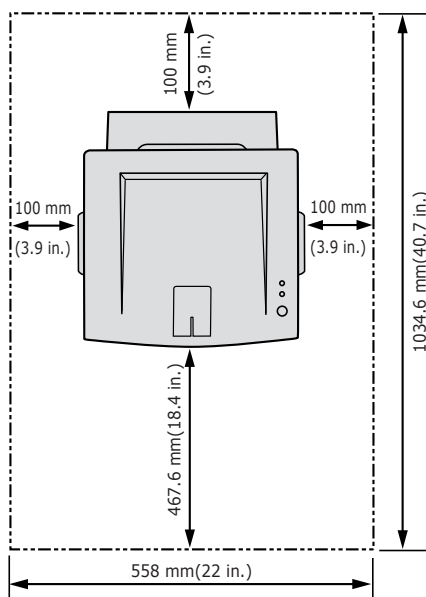
- 2 Carefully remove all of the packing tape from the printer.



Selecting a Location

Select a level, stable place with adequate space for air circulation. Allow extra space for opening covers and tray(s). The area should be well-ventilated and away from direct sunlight or sources of heat, cold, and humidity. See the image below for clearance space. Do not place the printer close to the edge of your desk or table.

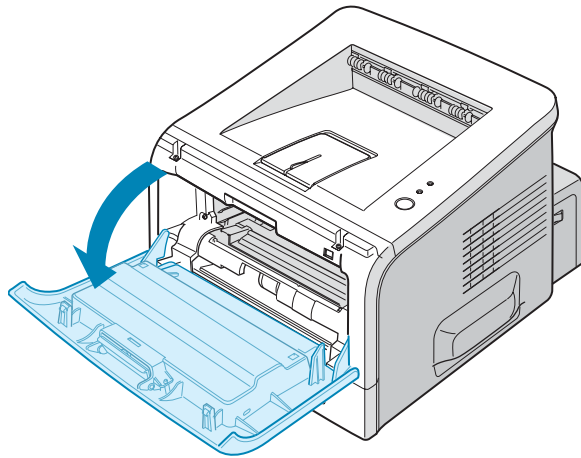
Clearance Space



- **Front:** 467.6 mm
(enough space so that tray(s) can be removed)
- **Back:** 100 mm
(enough space to allow opening of the rear out tray)
- **Right:** 100 mm (enough space for ventilation)
- **Left:** 100 mm

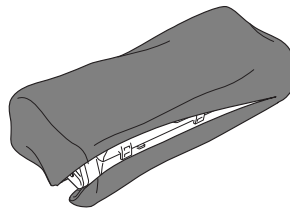
Installing the Toner Cartridge

- 1 Grasp the front cover and pull it toward you to open.



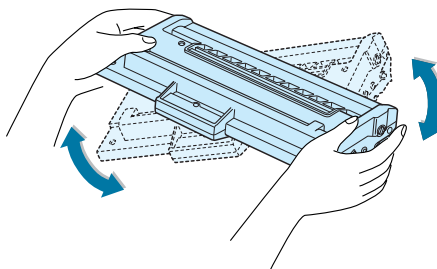
NOTE: Because the printer is very light, it may move when you use it; for example, when opening/closing the tray or installing/removing the toner cartridge. Be careful not to move the printer.

- 2 Remove the toner cartridge from its bag and remove the paper covering the cartridge.



Don't use a knife or other sharp object as it might scratch the drum of the cartridge.

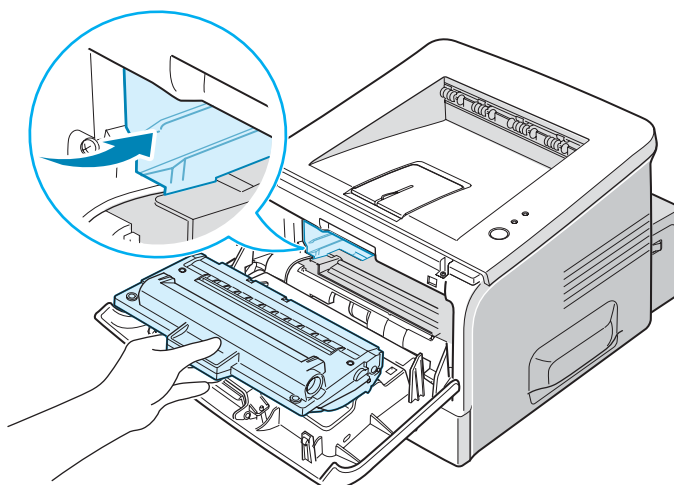
- 3** Gently shake the cartridge from side to side to distribute the toner evenly inside the cartridge.



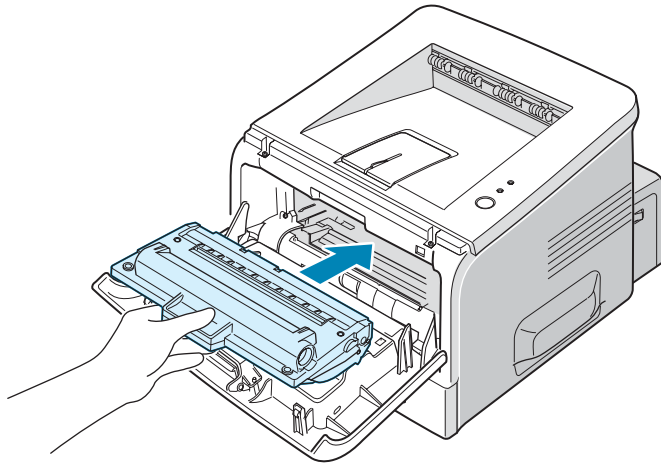
NOTES:

- To prevent damage, do not expose the toner cartridge to light for more than a few minutes. Cover it with a piece of paper if left exposed for more than a few minutes and keep it in a flat and clean place.
- If toner gets on your clothing, wipe it off with a dry cloth and wash clothing in cold water. Hot water sets toner into fabric.

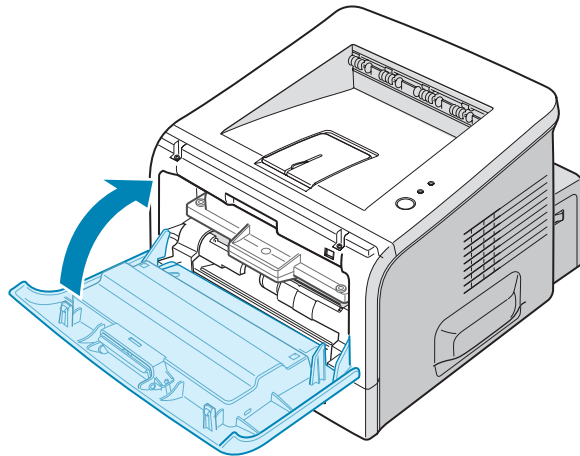
- 4** Locate the cartridge slots inside the printer, one on each side.



- 5** Grasp the handle and insert the cartridge into the printer until it snaps into place.



- 6** Close the front cover. Make sure that the cover is securely closed.

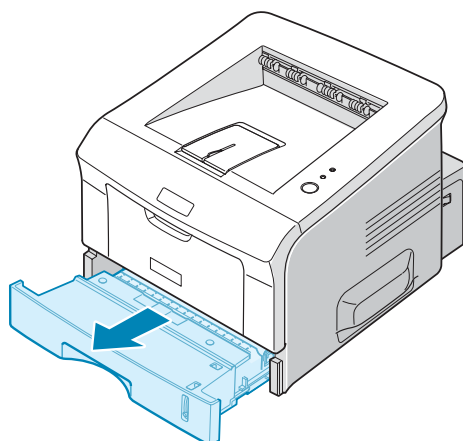


NOTE: When printing text at 5% coverage, you can expect a toner cartridge life of approximately 5,000 pages. (3,500 pages for the toner cartridge that is shipped with the machine)

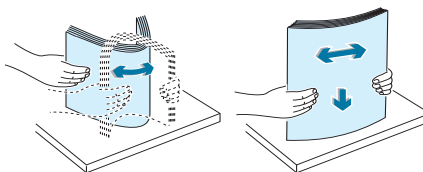
Loading Paper

You can load approximately 250 sheets of paper in the tray.

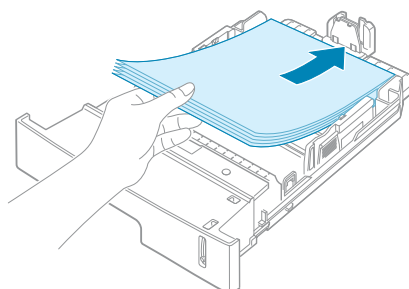
- 1 Pull the tray out of the printer.



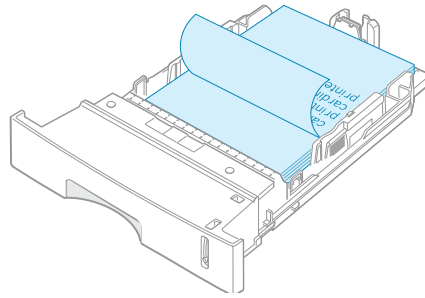
- 2 Prepare a stack of paper for loading by flexing or fanning the paper back and forth. Straighten the edges on a level surface.



- 3 Load paper **with the print side facing down**.



You can load previously printed paper. The printed side should be facing up with an uncurled edge on top. If you experience problems with paper feed, turn the paper around.

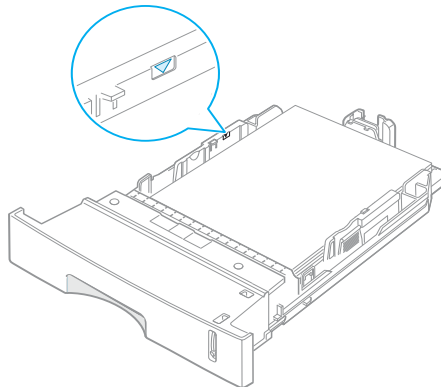


Make sure that all four corners are flat in the tray.

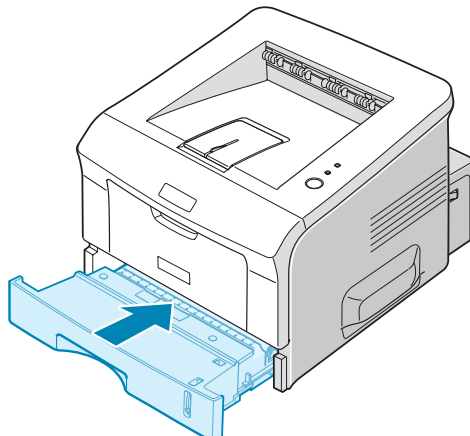


NOTE: If you want to change the paper size in the tray, see “Changing the Paper Size in the Paper Tray” on page 2.9.

- 4** Pay attention to the paper limit mark on the left inside wall of the tray. Paper overloading may cause paper jams.



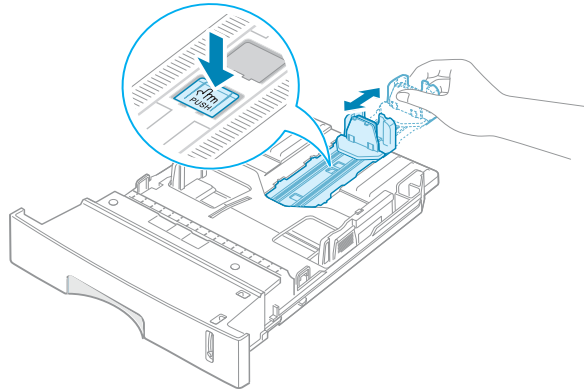
- 5** Slide the tray back into the printer.



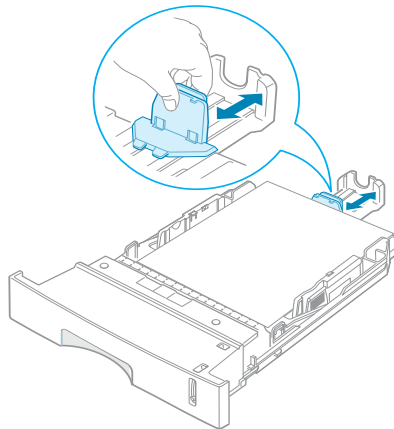
Changing the Paper Size in the Paper Tray

To load longer sizes of paper, you need to adjust the paper guides to extend the paper tray.

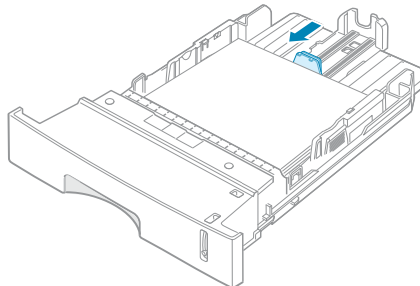
- 1 Pressing and unlatching the guide lock, slide the paper length guide out completely to extend the paper tray to its full length.



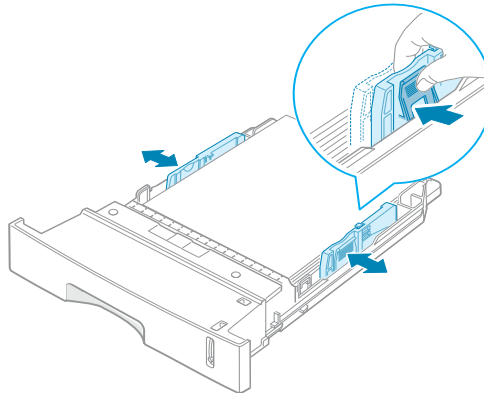
- 2 After inserting paper into the tray, slide in the guide until it lightly touches the end of the paper stack.



For the paper smaller than Letter, adjust the front paper length guide.

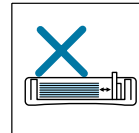
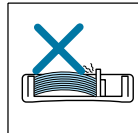
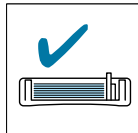


- 3** Pinching the paper width guide as shown, move it toward the stack of paper until it lightly touches the side of the stack.



NOTES:

- Do not push the paper width guide far enough to cause the materials to warp.
- If you do not adjust the paper width guide, it may cause paper jams.



Connecting a Printer Cable

For Local Printing

To print from your computer in a local environment, you need to connect your printer to the computer with either a parallel interface cable or a Universal Serial Bus (USB) cable.

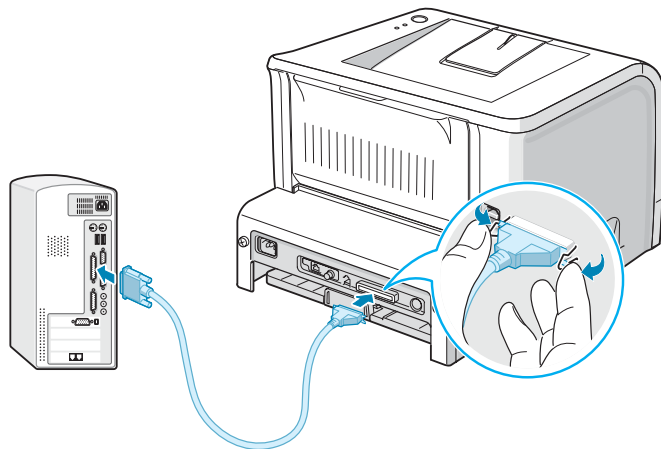
Using a Parallel Cable



NOTE: To connect the printer to the parallel port of the computer requires a certified parallel cable. You will need to buy an IEEE1284 compliant cable.

- 1 Make sure that both the printer and the computer are turned off.
- 2 Plug the parallel printer cable into the connector on the back of the printer.

Push the metal clips down to fit inside the notches on the cable plug.



- 3 Connect the other end of the cable to the parallel interface port on your computer, and tighten the screws.

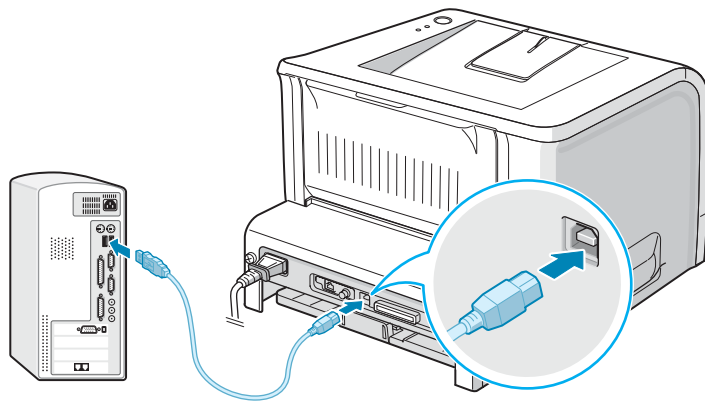

Using a USB Cable



NOTE: Connecting the printer to the USB port of the computer requires a certified USB cable. You will need to buy a USB 2.0 compliant cable that is within 3 m in length.

- 1 Make sure that both the printer and the computer are turned off.
- 2 Plug the USB printer cable into the connector on the back of the printer.
- 3 Connect the other end of the cable to the USB port on your computer.



See your computer User's Guide, if you need help.



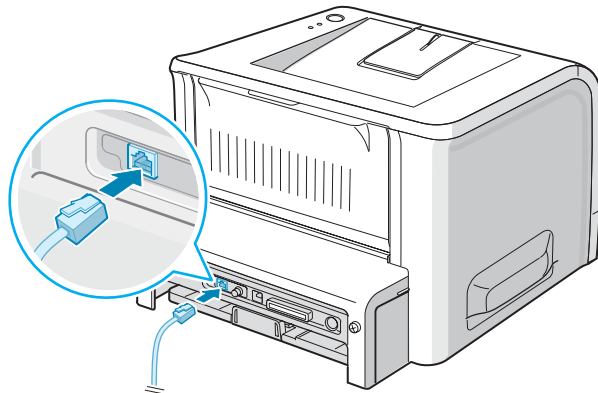
NOTE: For using a USB cable, you must be running Windows 98/Me/2000/XP.

For Network Printing

You can attach your BP20N printer to a network using an Ethernet cable (UTP cable with RJ.45 connector).

- 1 Make sure that both the printer and the computer are turned off.
- 2 Plug one end of the Ethernet cable into the Ethernet network port on the Printer.

To the network LAN connection

- 3 Plug the other end of the cable into a network LAN connection.

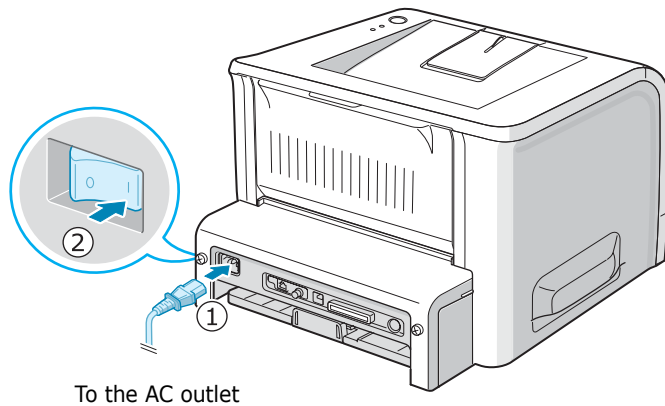

Turning the Printer On

- 1 Plug the power cord into the power receptacle on the back of the printer.
- 2 Plug the other end into a properly grounded AC outlet and turn on the printer using the power switch.



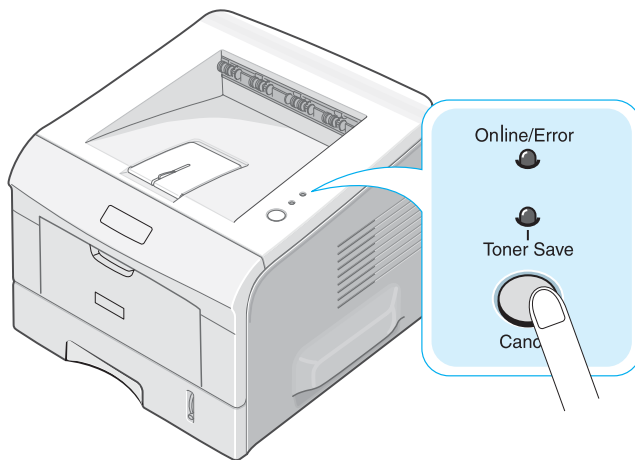
CAUTIONS:

- The fusing area at the rear portion of the inside of your printer is hot when powered. Be careful not to be burned when accessing this area.
 - Do not disassemble the printer when it is powered. Doing so may give you an electric shock.

Printing a Demo Page

Print a demo page to make sure that the printer is operating correctly.

- 1 Hold down the **Cancel** button for about 2 seconds to print a demo page.



- 2 A demo page showing the printer's features and capabilities prints out.

Installing Printer Software

The supplied CD-ROM contains Windows printing software, DOS RCP, an on-line User's Guide and Acrobat Reader to view the User's Guide.

If you are printing from Windows:

You can install the following printer software using the CD-ROM.

- **Aficio BP20 Series PCL6 printer driver** for Windows. Use this driver to take full advantage of your printer's features. See page 2.18.
- **Status Monitor** appears when printing error occurs. See page 4.29.
- **Remote Control Panel** for DOS applications. For information about using the program, refer to Appendix A in the User's Guide.
- The **Set IP** is for setting IP address. It will help for user to easily set IP address. See page 2.32

Installing Printer Software in Windows

System Requirements

Verify the following:

- At least **32 MB** (Windows 9x/Me), **64 MB** (Windows 2000/NT), **128 MB** (Windows XP) or more of RAM is installed on your PC.
- There is at least **300 MB** of free disk space on your PC.
- All applications are closed on your PC before beginning installation.
- You are using Windows 95, Windows 98, Windows Me, Windows NT 4.0, Windows 2000, or Windows XP.
- You are using at least Internet Explorer 5.0.

Installing Software for Local Printing

A local printer is a printer directly attached to your computer using the printer cable supplied with your printer, such as a USB or parallel cable. If your printer is attached to a network, skip this step and go to "Installing Software for Network Printing" on page 2.24.

You can install the printer software using the typical or custom method.



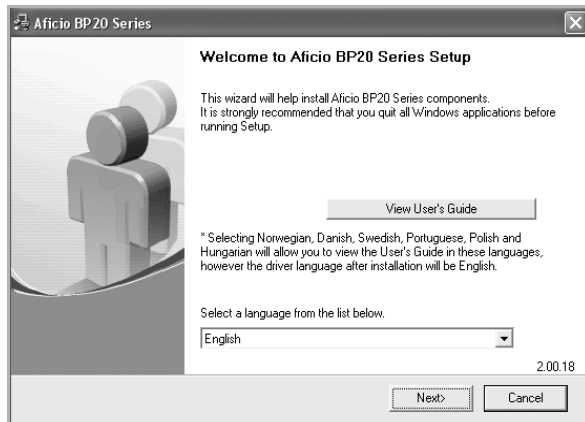
NOTE: If the "New Hardware Wizard" window appears during the installation procedure, click ☐ in the upper right corner of the box to close the window, or click **Cancel**.

Typical Installation

This is recommended for most users. All components necessary for printer operations will be installed.

- 1** Make sure that the printer is connected to your computer and powered on.
- 2** Insert the supplied CD-ROM into your CD-ROM drive. The CD-ROM should automatically run, and an installation window appears.

If the installation window does not appear, click **Start** and then **Run**. Type **X:\Setup.exe**, replacing “X” with the letter which represents your drive and click **OK**.

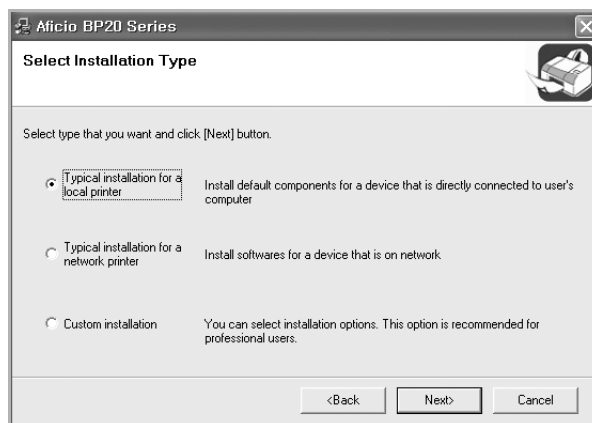

Installing Software for Network Printing

When you connect your printer to a network, you must first configure the TCP/IP settings for the printer. After you have assigned and verified the TCP/IP settings, you are ready to install the software on each computer on the network.

You can install the printer software using the typical or custom method.

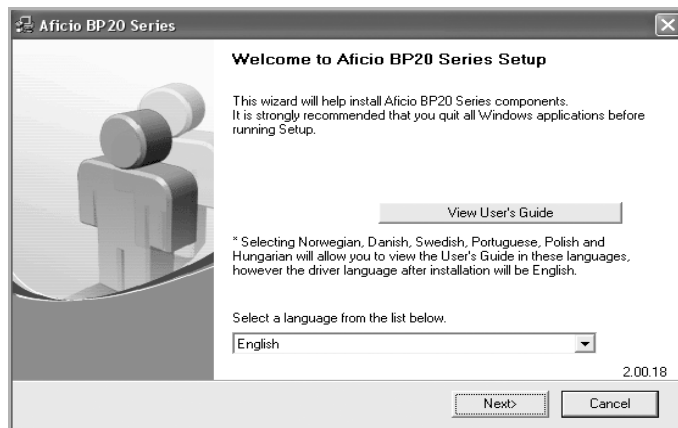
Typical Installation

This is recommended for most users. All components(Printer Driver, Set IP, Multi Direct Print Type S IPP port) necessary for printer operations will be installed.

In Windows 98/Me and NT4.0, Multi Direct Print Type S will be installed as a network printer port, too.

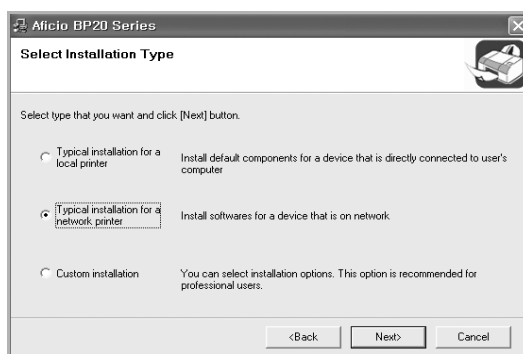
- 1 Make sure that the printer is connected to your network and powered on. For details about connecting to the network, see the Administrator Guide.
- 2 Insert the supplied CD-ROM into your CD-ROM drive.
The CD-ROM should automatically run, and an installation window appears.

If the installation window does not appear, click **Start** and then **Run**. Type **X:\Setup.exe**, replacing “X” with the letter which represents your drive and click **OK**.

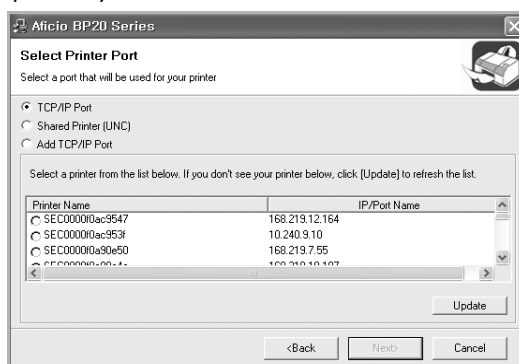


- 3 Click **Next**.
 - If necessary, select a language from the drop-down list.
 - **View User's Guide:** Allows you to view the User's Guide and Administrator Guide. If your computer doesn't have Adobe Acrobat, click on this option and it will automatically install Adobe Acrobat Reader for you.

4 Select **Typical installation for a network printer**. Click **Next**.

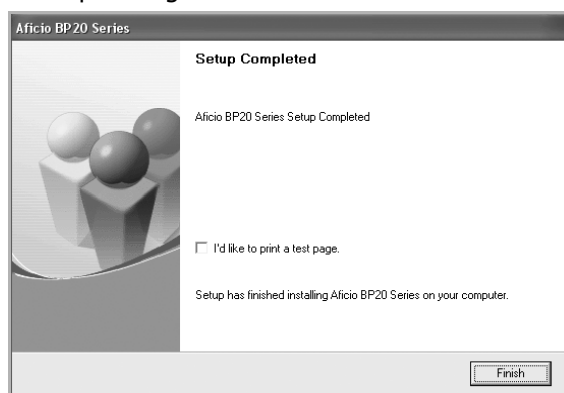


5 The list of printers available on the network appears. Select the printer you want to install from the list and then click **Next**.



- If you do not see your printer on the list, click **Update** to refresh the list, or select **Add TCP/IP Port** to add your printer to the network. To add the printer to the network, enter the port name and the IP address for the printer.
- To find a shared network printer (UNC Path), select **Shared Printer [UNC]** and enter the shared name manually or find a shared printer by clicking the **Browse** button.

6 After the installation is finished, a window appears asking you to print a test page. If you so desire, select the corresponding check box and Click **Finish**.



NOTE: After setup is complete, if your printer driver doesn't work properly, reinstall the printer driver. See "Reinstalling Printer Software" on page 2.30.

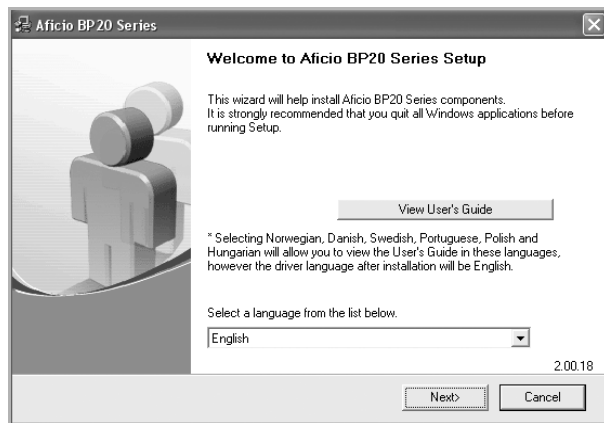

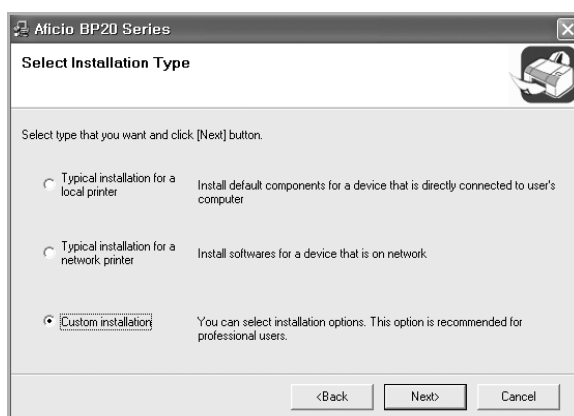

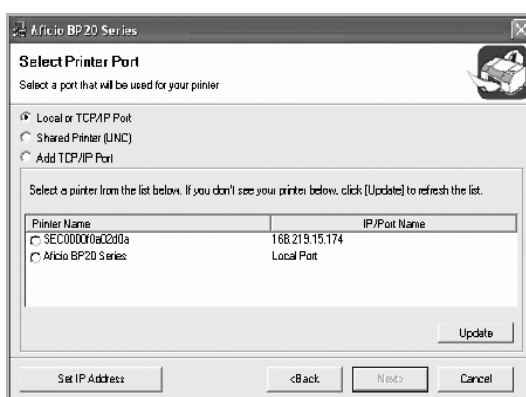

5 The list of printers available on the network appears. Select the printer you want to install from the list and then click **Next**.



- If you do not see your printer on the list, click **Update** to refresh the list, or select **Add TCP/IP Port** to add your printer to the network. To add the printer to the network, enter the port name and the IP address for the printer.
- To find a shared network printer (UNC Path), select **Shared Printer [UNC]** and enter the shared name manually or find a shared printer by clicking the **Browse** button.

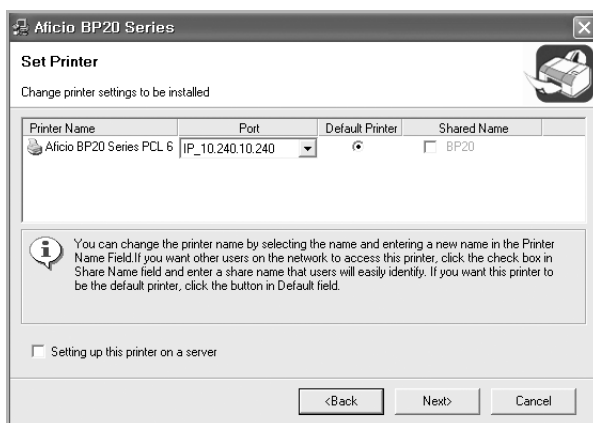

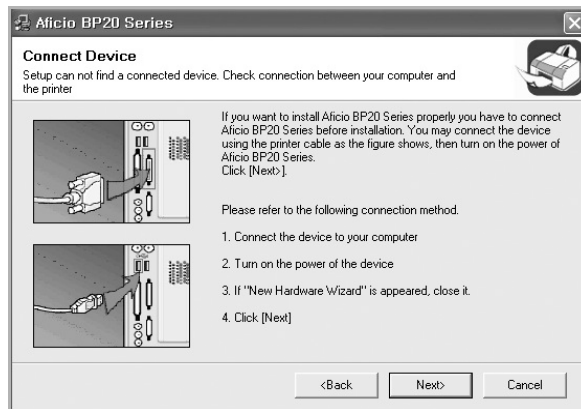

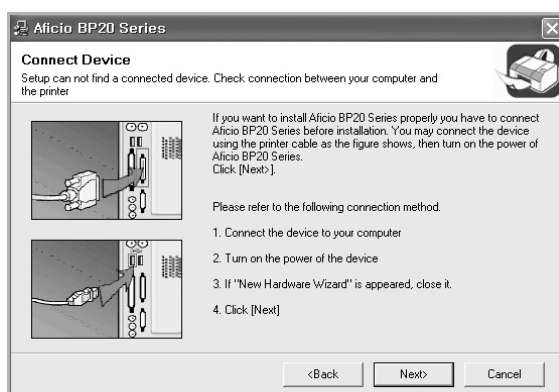

This chapter will help you understand types of paper you can use with your printer and how to properly load paper in the different paper trays for the best print quality.

Choosing Paper and Other Materials

You can print on a variety of print materials, such as plain paper, envelopes, labels, transparencies, and so on. See “Paper Specifications” on page C.3. To get the best possible print quality, use only high-quality copier-grade paper.

When you choose print materials, consider the following:

- **Desired outcome:** The paper you choose should be appropriate for the project.
- **Size:** You can use any size paper that fits easily within the paper adjusters of the paper tray.
- **Weight :** Your printer supports paper weight as follows:
 - 16~24 lbs (60~90 g/m²) bond for the Tray1 or optional Tray2
 - 16~43 lbs (60~163 g/m²) bond for the Multi-Purpose Tray
- **Brightness:** Some papers are whiter than others and produce sharper, more vibrant images.
- **Surface smoothness:** The smoothness of the paper affects how crisp the printing looks on the paper.



NOTE: Using a material that does not conform to the specifications listed in the paper specification can cause problems that may require service. This service is not covered by the warranty or service agreements.

Guidelines for Paper and Special Materials

When selecting or loading paper, envelopes, or other special materials, keep these guidelines in mind:

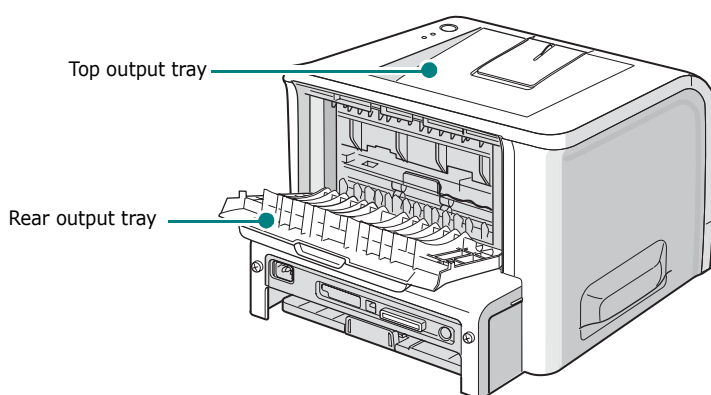
- Attempting to print on damp, curled, wrinkled, or torn paper can cause paper jams and poor print quality.
- Use cut-sheet paper only. You cannot use multi-part paper.
- Use only high-quality, copier grade paper for the best print quality.
- Do not use paper that has already been printed on or that has been fed through a photocopier.
- Do not use paper with irregularities, such as tabs or staples.
- Do not attempt to load any tray during printing and never overfill the tray. This could cause a paper jam.
- Avoid paper with embossed lettering, perforations, or texture that is too smooth or too rough.
- Coloured paper should be of the same high quality as white photocopy paper. The pigments must withstand the printer's fusing temperature of 400°F (205°C) for 0.1 second without deterioration. Do not use paper with a coloured coating that was added after the paper was produced.
- Preprinted forms must be printed with nonflammable, heat-resistant inks that do not melt, vaporize, or release hazardous emissions when subject to the printer's approximately 400°F (205°C) fusing temperature for 0.1 second.
- Store paper in its ream wrapper until ready to use. Place cartons on pallets or shelves, not on the floor.
- Do not place heavy objects on top of the paper, whether it is packaged or unpackaged.
- Keep paper away from moisture, direct sunlight, or other conditions that can cause it to wrinkle or curl.



NOTE: Do not use carbonless paper or tracing paper. They are unstable at the fusing temperature and can give off fumes, or cause damage to the paper.

Selecting the Output Location

The printer has two output locations; the rear output tray and the top output tray.



To use the top output tray, be sure that the rear output tray is closed. To use the rear output tray, open it.

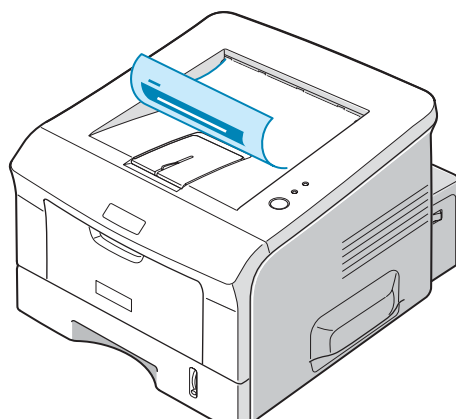


NOTES:

- If paper coming out of the top output tray has problems, such as excessive curl, try printing to the rear output tray.
- To avoid paper jams, do not open or close the rear output tray while the printer is printing.

Printing to the Top Output Tray *(Face down)*

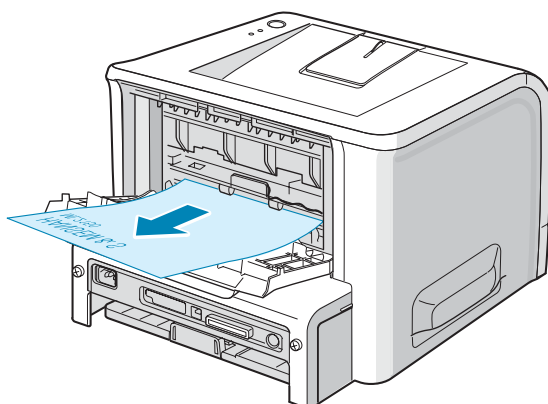
The top output tray collects paper face-down, in the order in which it was printed. The top output tray should be used for most print jobs.



CAUTION: If you continuously print many pages, the surface of the output tray may become hot. Be careful not to touch the surface, and especially keep children away from the surface.

Printing to the Rear Output Tray (Face up)

The printer always prints to the rear output tray if it is open. Paper comes out of the printer face-up, and each time a sheet of paper comes out, it falls down from the printer.

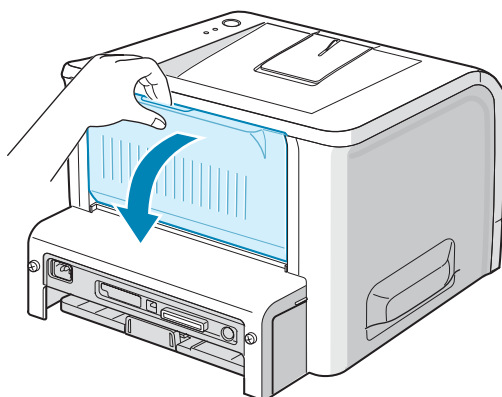


Printing from the Multi-Purpose Tray to the rear output tray provides a **straight paper path**. Opening the rear output tray might improve the output quality with the following:

- envelopes
- labels
- transparencies

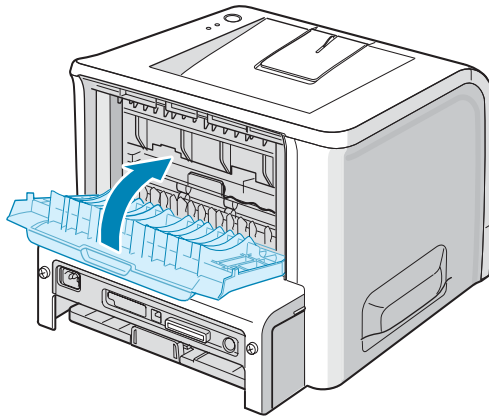
To open the rear output tray:

- 1 Open the rear door by pulling it down. The cover functions as the output tray.



CAUTION: The fusing area at the rear portion of the inside of your printer is hot when powered. Be careful not to be burned when accessing this area.

- 2** If you do not want to use the rear output tray, close the tray. The pages will stack on the top output tray.

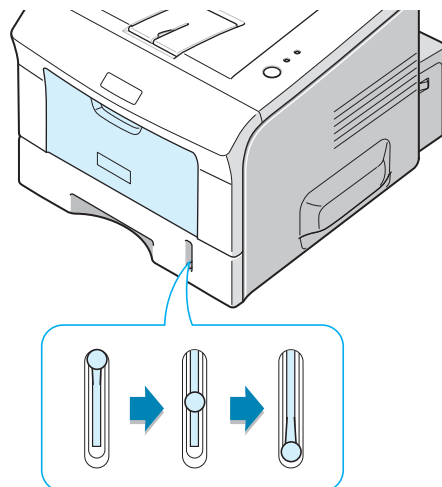

Loading Paper

Proper paper loading helps prevent paper jams and ensure trouble-free printing. Do not remove the paper tray while a job is printing. Doing so may cause a paper jam. See "Sizes and Capacities" on page 3.3 for acceptable paper size and capacities for each tray.

The paper level bar on the front of the paper tray(s) shows the amount of paper currently left in the tray. When the tray is empty, the indicator drops to the bottom.

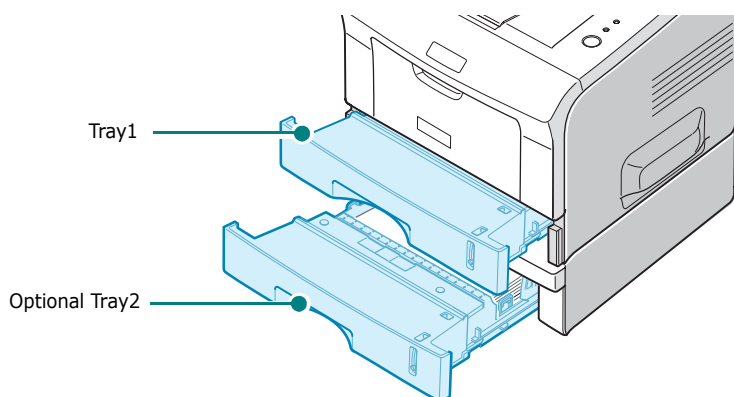


Paper full ▲

Using Tray1 or the Optional Tray2

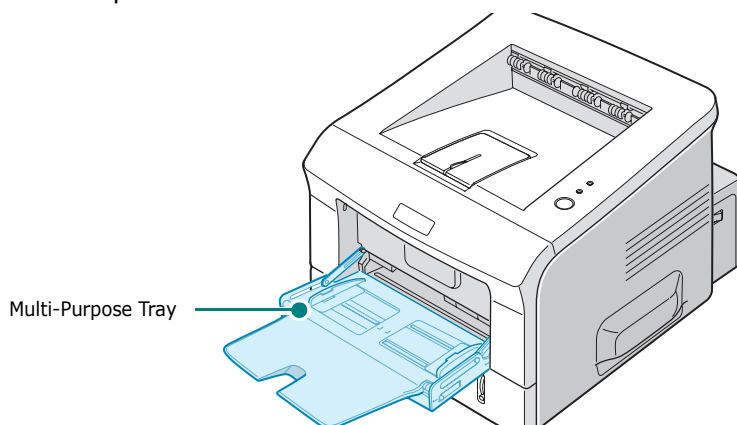
Tray1 and the optional Tray2 can hold up to 250 sheets of paper. See “Sizes and Capacities” on page 3.3 for acceptable paper size and capacities of each tray.



Load a stack of paper into the tray and print. For details about loading paper in Tray1 or the optional Tray2, see “Loading Paper” on page 2.7.

Using the Multi-Purpose Tray

The multi-Purpose Tray is located in the front of your printer. It can be closed when you are not using it, making the printer more compact.

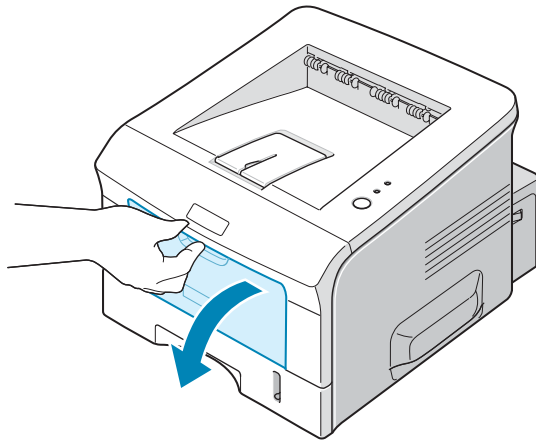


The Multi-Purpose Tray can hold several sizes and types of paper, such as transparencies, cards, and envelopes. You may also want to use the Multi-Purpose Tray for single page print jobs on letterhead, coloured paper for use as separator sheets, or other special materials that you do not normally keep in the paper tray. You can load approximately 50 sheets of plain paper, 5 envelopes, 5 transparencies, 5 sheets of card stock or 5 labels at a time.

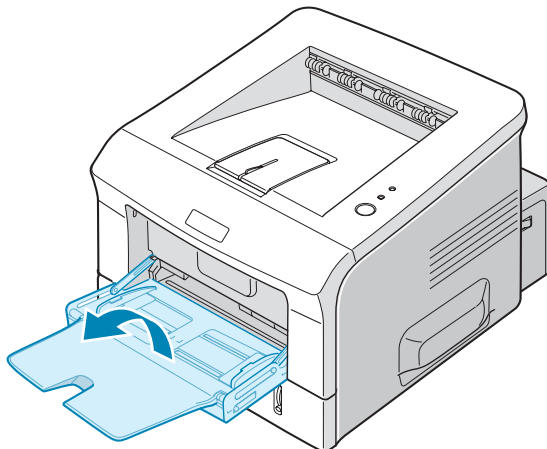
- Load only one size of print material at a time in the Multi-Purpose Tray.
- To prevent paper jams, do not add paper when there is still paper in the Multi-Purpose Tray. This also applies to other types of print materials.
- Print materials should be loaded face up with the top edge going into the Multi-Purpose Tray first and be placed on the centre of the tray.
- Do not place objects on the Multi-Purpose Tray. Also avoid pressing down or applying excessive force on it. The tray may fall from the printer.

To load paper in the Multi-Purpose Tray:

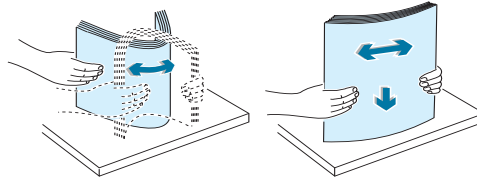
- 1 Pull the Multi-Purpose Tray down towards you.



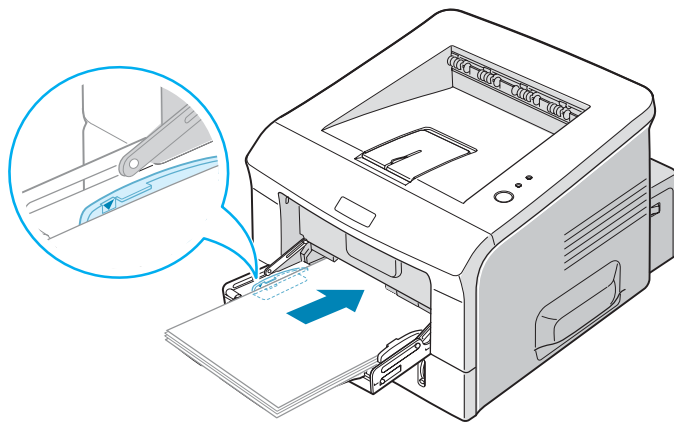
- 2 Unfold the extender to extend the tray to its full-length to hold longer paper.



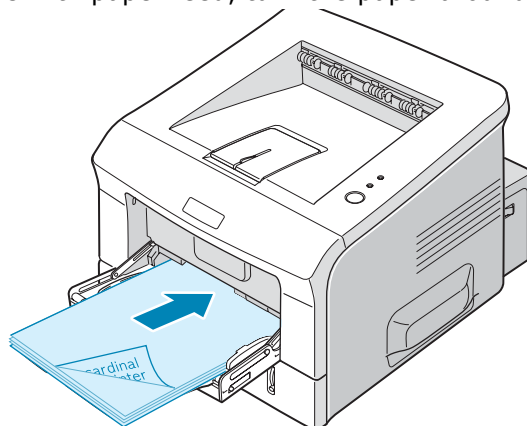
- 3** Prepare a stack of paper for loading by flexing or fanning the paper back and forth. Straighten the edges on a level surface.



- 4** Place paper on the centre of the tray **with the print side face up**. Pay attention to the paper limit mark on the left inside wall of the tray. Paper overloading may cause paper jams.

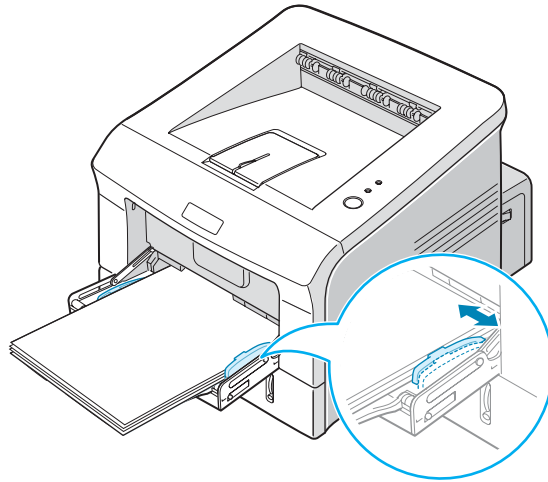


If you want to print on previously printed paper from the Multi-Purpose Tray, the printed side should be facing down with an uncurled edge to the printer. If you experience problems with paper feed, turn the paper around.



NOTE: Make sure that you have not loaded too much print material. The print material buckles if you load a stack that is too deep or push it in too far.

- 5 Slide the paper width guide and adjust it against the stack of print material without bending.

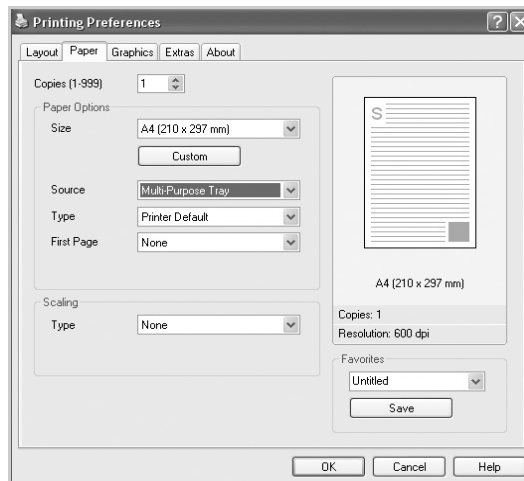

NOTE: Your printer cannot automatically detect the size of paper loaded in the Multi-Purpose Tray. Loading the Multi-Purpose Tray with the correct paper size allows you to select paper by size rather than paper source when you print from your software application. You do not have to check which paper is loaded in the Multi-purpose Tray before printing.

- 6 When you print a document, select the paper source and type in the software application.



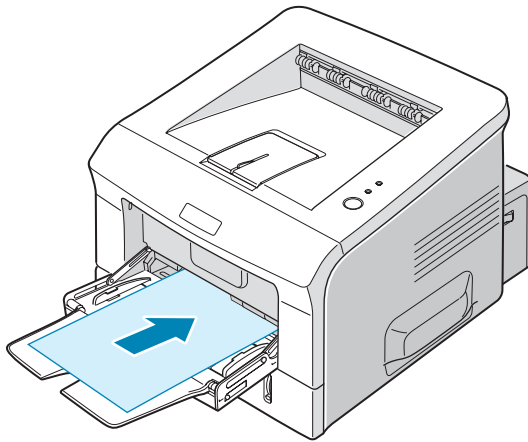
- 7 After printing, push the extender back to its place and close the Multi-Purpose Tray.

Using the Manual Feed Mode

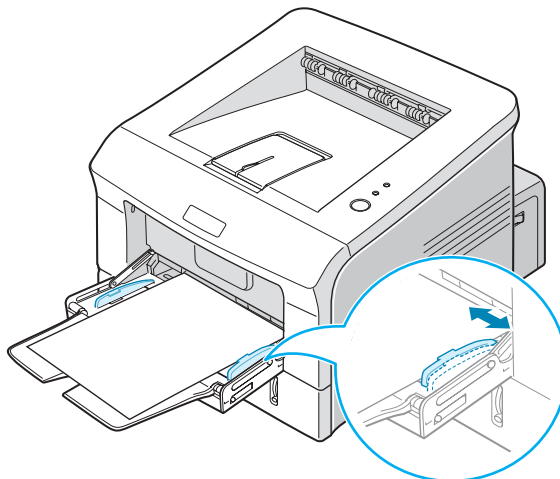
If you select **Manual Feed** in the **Source** option when changing print settings, you can manually load a sheet of print material in the Multi-Purpose Tray. Manually loading paper can be helpful when you want to check the print quality after each page is printed.

This loading procedure is almost the same as the procedure for loading in the Multi-Purpose Tray, except you load paper sheet-by-sheet in the Tray, send print data to print the first page, and press the **Cancel** button on the control panel to print each following page.

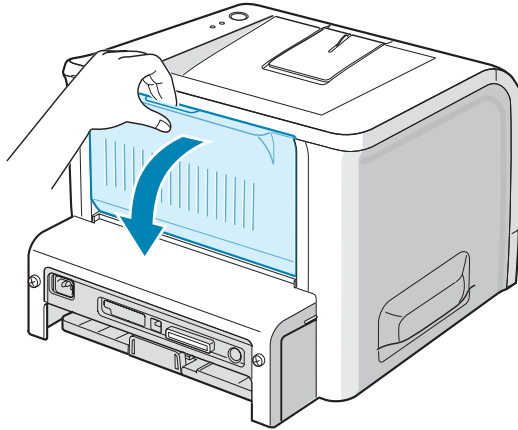
- 1 Load a sheet of print material on the centre of the Multi-Purpose Tray **with the print side up**.



- 2 Slide the paper width guide and adjust it against the material without bending.

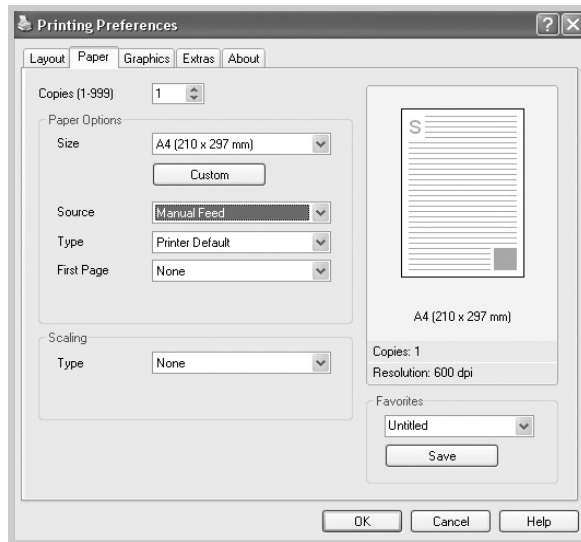


- 3 Open the rear output tray.



- 4 When you print a document, you must select **Manual Feed** for **Source** from the software application, and then select the correct paper size and type.

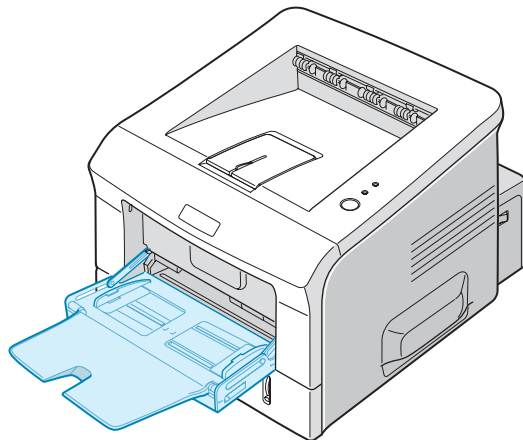

Printing on Envelopes

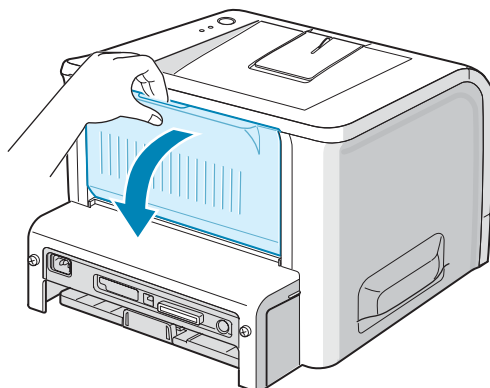
Guidelines

- Only use envelopes recommended for laser printers. Before loading envelopes into the Multi-Purpose Tray, make sure that they are undamaged and are not stuck together.
- Do not feed stamped envelopes.
- Never use envelopes with clasps, snaps, windows, coated lining, or self-stick adhesives. These envelopes may severely damage the printer.

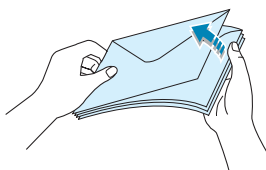
- 1 Open the Multi-Purpose Tray and unfold the extender to its full-length position.



- 2 Open the rear output tray.

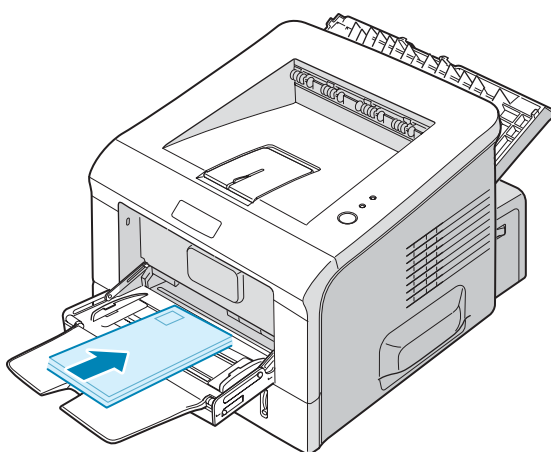


- 3** Flex or fan the edge of the envelope stack to separate the pages before loading.

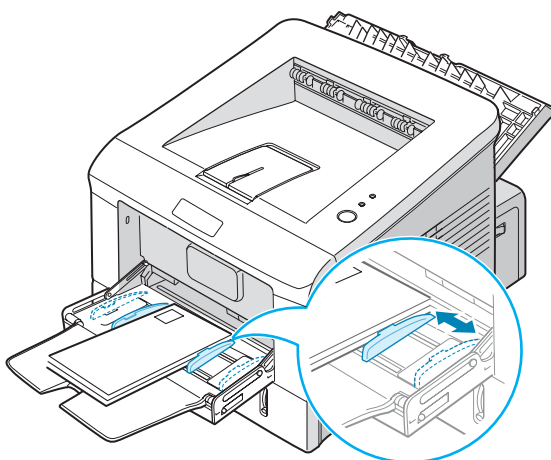

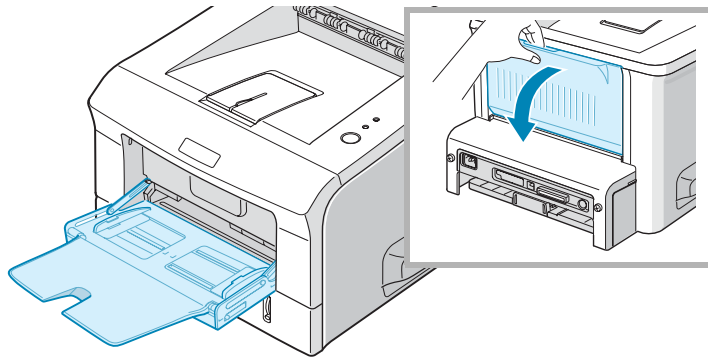
Printing on Labels

Guidelines

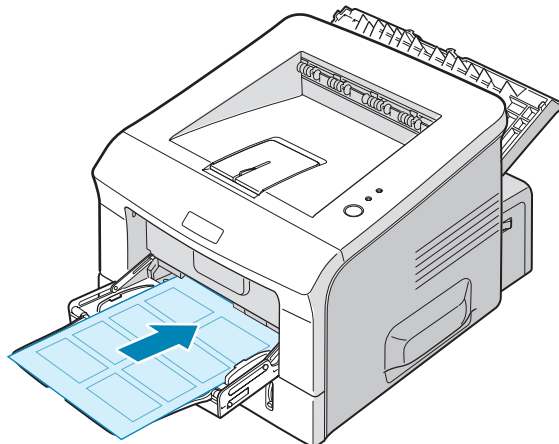
- Only use labels recommended for laser printers.
- Verify that the labels' adhesive material can tolerate fusing temperature of 205°C (400°F) for 0.1 second.
- Make sure that there is no exposed adhesive material between the labels. Exposed areas can cause labels to peel off during printing, which can cause paper jams. Exposed adhesive can also cause damage to printer components.
- Do not feed a sheet of labels through the printer more than once. The adhesive backing is designed for one pass through the printer.
- Do not use labels that are separating from the backing sheet or are wrinkled, bubbled, or otherwise damaged.

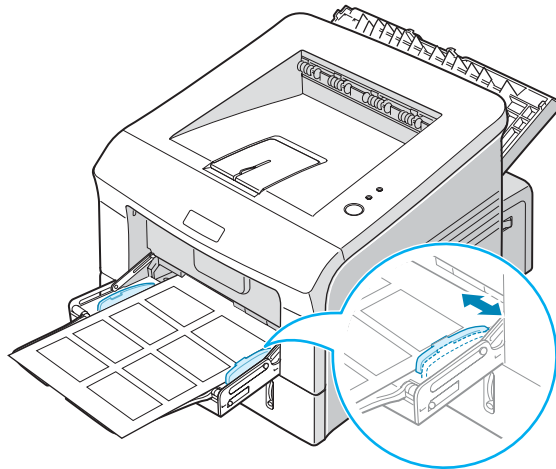
- 1 Open the Multi-Purpose Tray and the rear output tray.



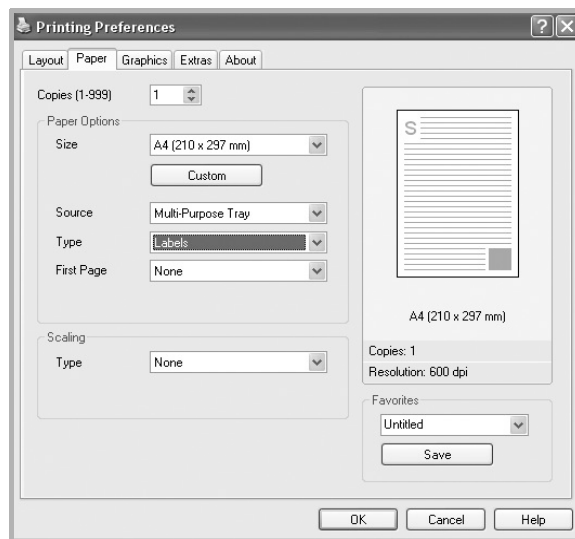
- 2 Load labels **with the print side up**.



- 3 Adjust the guide to fit the width of the sheet of labels.



- 4 When you print on labels, select the appropriate paper source, type, and size in the software application. For details, see page 4.6.



- 5 After printing, close the Multi-Purpose Tray and the rear output tray.



NOTE: To prevent labels from sticking, do not let the printed label sheets stack up as they are printed out.

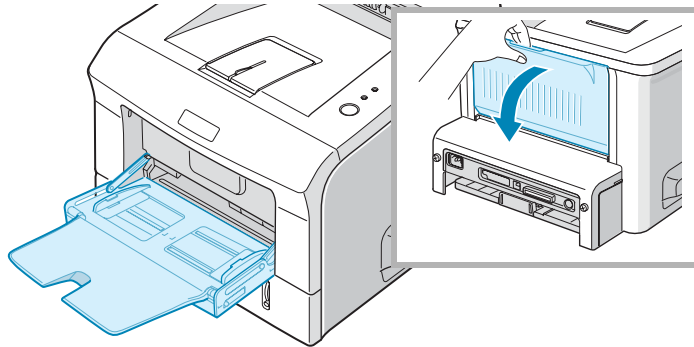
Printing on Transparencies

Guidelines

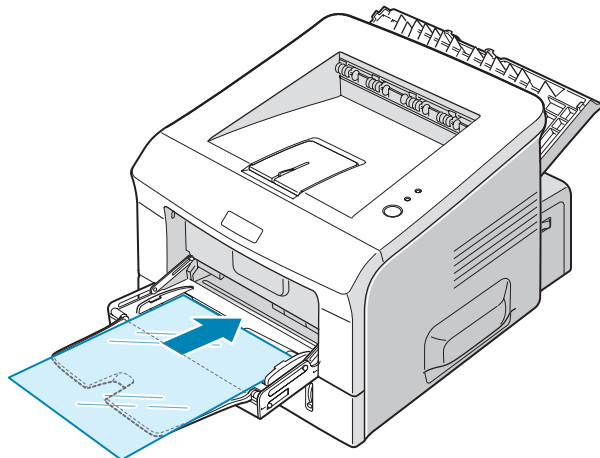
- Only use transparencies recommended for use in laser printers.
- Ensure that transparencies are not wrinkled, curled, or have any torn edges.
- Hold the transparencies by the edges and avoid touching the print side. Oils deposited on the transparency can cause print quality problems.
- Be careful not to scratch or leave fingerprints on the print side.

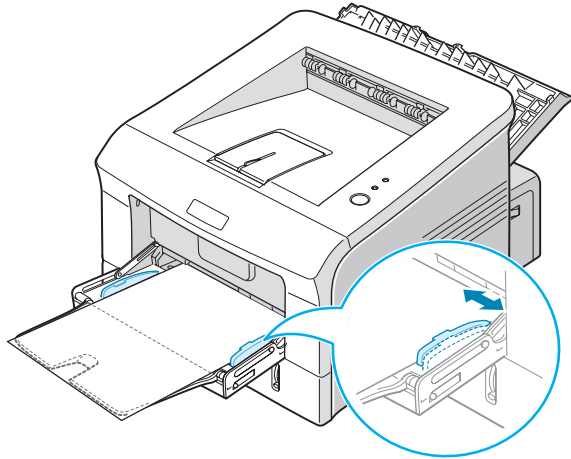
- 1 Open the Multi-Purpose Tray and the rear output tray.



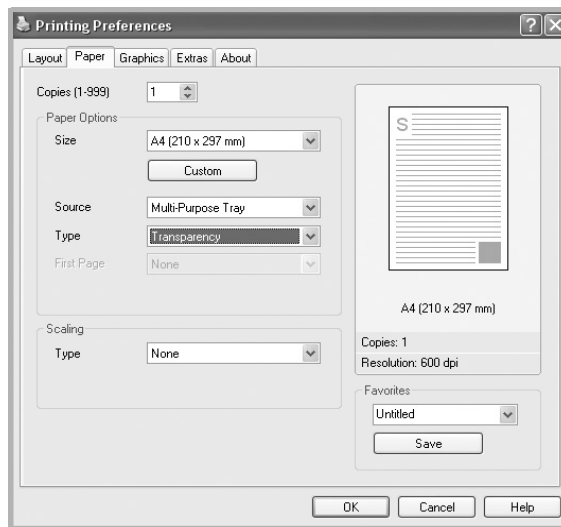
- 2 Load transparencies **with the print side up**, and **the top with the adhesive strip entering the printer first**.



- 3** Adjust the guide to fit the width of the transparencies.



- 4** When you print on transparencies, select the appropriate paper source, type, and size in the software application. For details, see page 4.6.



- 5** After printing, close the Multi-Purpose Tray and the rear output tray.



NOTES:

- If you print on thin transparencies to the rear output tray, they can curl. In this case, use the top output tray. If the problem persists, check if your transparencies meet the printer's specifications.
- To prevent transparencies from sticking, do not let the printed sheets stack up as they are printed out.
- Place transparencies on a flat surface after removing them from the printer.

Printing on Card Stock or Custom-sized Materials

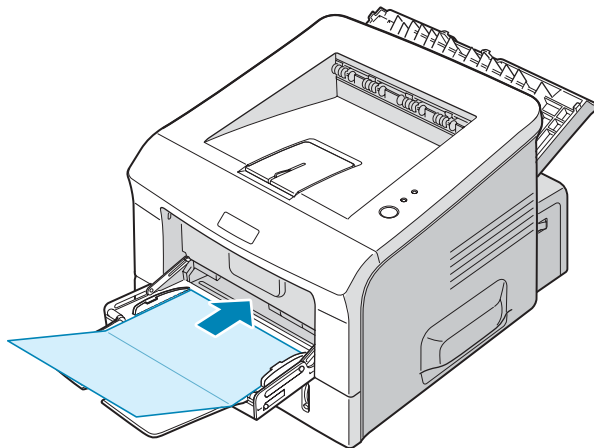
Postcards, 3.5 by 5.83 in. (index) cards and other custom-sized materials can be printed with your printer. The minimum size is 76 by 127 mm (3 by 5 in.) and the maximum size is 216 by 356 mm (8.5 by 14 in.).

Guidelines

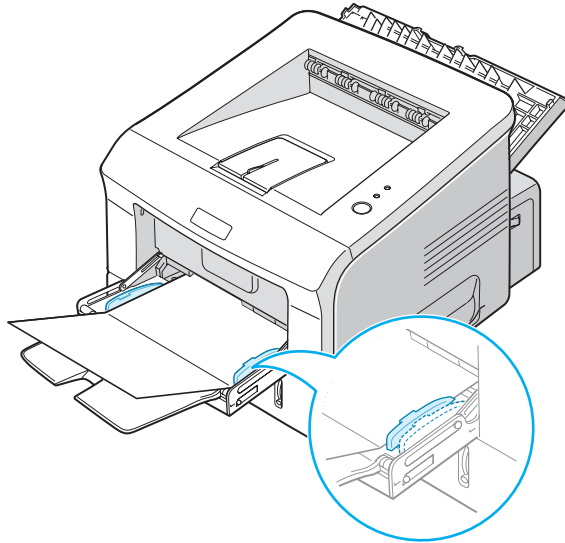
- Always insert the short-edge into the Multi-Purpose Tray first. If you want to print in landscape mode, make this selection through your software. Inserting paper long-edge first may cause a paper jam.
- Do not load more than 5 cards into the Multi-Purpose Tray at a time.
- Do not print on media smaller than 76 mm (3 in.) wide or 127 mm (5 in.) long.
- Set margins at least 6.4 mm (0.25 in.) away from the edges of the material in the software application

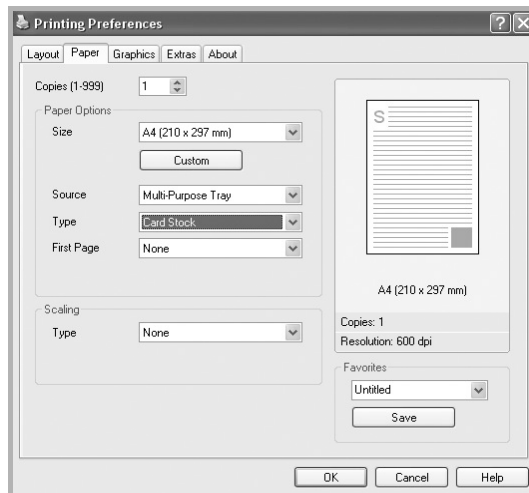
- 1 Open the Multi-Purpose Tray and the rear output tray.
- 2 Load print material with print side up and short edge first.



- 3 Adjust the guide to fit the width of the material stack.



- 4 When you print, select the appropriate paper source, type, and size in the software application. For details, see page 4.6.

- If the size of your print material is not listed in the **Size** box in the **Paper** tab of the printer driver properties, click the **Custom** button and set the size manually. See page 4.6.
- When you use 76 by 127 mm (3 by 5 in.) paper and it is too thin, a paper jam may occur. Use card stock heavier than 105g/m²

- 5 After printing, close the Multi-Purpose Tray and the rear output tray.

Printing on Preprinted Paper

Preprinted paper is paper that has some type of printing placed on it before it is sent through the printer (paper that has a preprinted logo at the top of the page, for example).

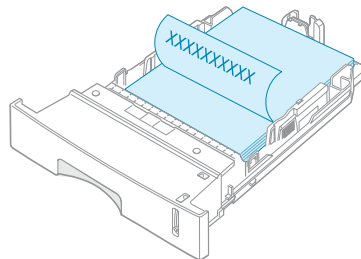
Guidelines

- Letterheads must be printed with heat-resistant ink that will not melt, vaporize, or release hazardous emissions when subjected to the printer's fusing temperature of 400 °F (205 °C) for 0.1 second.
- Ink on letterheads must be non-flammable and should not adversely affect any printer rollers.
- Forms and letterhead should be sealed in a moisture-proof wrapping to prevent changes during storage.
- Before you load preprinted paper as forms and letterhead, verify that the ink on the paper is dry. During the fusing process, wet ink can come off preprinted paper.

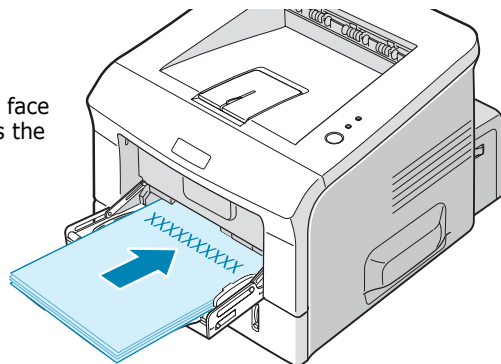

- 1 Load letterhead into the tray you want to use, as shown in the figures below. Adjust the guides to fit the width of the paper stack.

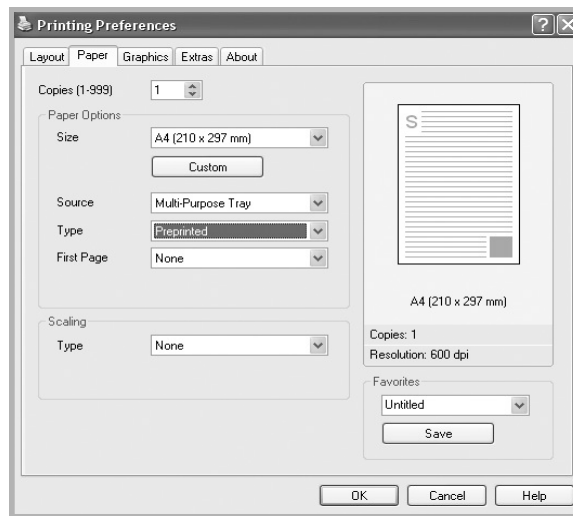

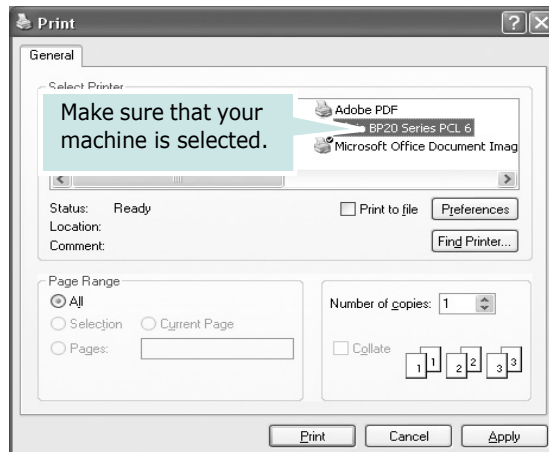

Printing a Document in Windows

The following procedure describes the general steps required for printing from various Windows applications. The exact steps for printing a document may vary depending on the application program you are using. Refer to the User's Guide of your software application for the exact printing procedure.

- 1 Open the document you want to print.
- 2 Select **Print** from the **File** menu. The Print window opens. It may look slightly different depending on your application.

You can select the basic print settings within the Print window. These settings include the number of copies and the print range.

- 3 To take advantage of the printer features provided by your machine, click **Properties** or **Preferences** in the application's Print window. Go to step 4.

If you see a **Setup**, **Printer**, or **Options** button in your Print window, click it instead. Then click **Properties** on the next screen.

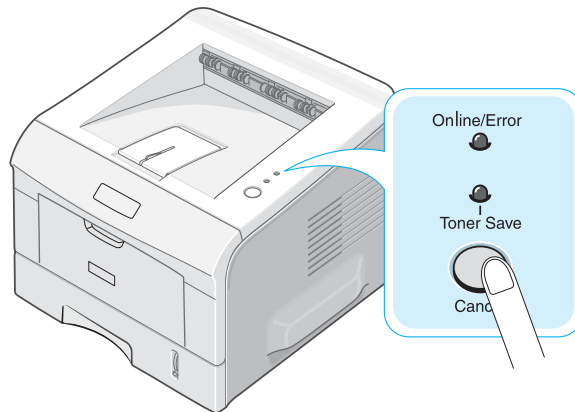
- 4 Click **OK** to close the printer properties window.
- 5 To start the print job, click **OK** or **Print** in the Print window.

Cancelling a Print Job

There are two ways to cancel a print job.

To stop a print job from the control panel:

Press the **Cancel** button on the control panel.

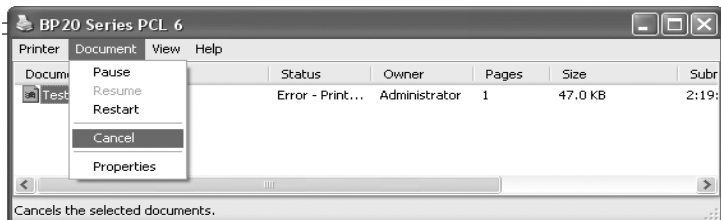

The printer will finish printing the page that is moving through the printer and delete the rest of the print job. Pressing the button cancels only the current job in the printer. If more than one print job is in the printer memory, the button must be pressed once for each job.

To stop a print job from the Printers folder:

- 1 From the Windows **Start** menu, select **Settings**.
- 2 Select **Printers** to open the Printers window, and double-click the **Aficio BP20 Series PCL6** icon.

Printer Settings

You can use the Aficio BP20 Series PCL6 printer properties window, which allows you to access all of the printer options you need when using your machine. When the printer properties are displayed, you can review and change whatever settings are needed for your print job.

The printer's properties window may differ, depending on your operating system. This User's Guide shows the Printing Preferences window for Windows XP.

Your printer's Printing Preferences window consists of 5 tabs: **Layout**, **Paper**, **Graphics**, **Extras**, and **About**.

If you access printer properties through the **Printers** folder, you can view additional Windows-based tabs (refer to your Windows User's Guide) and the **Printer** tab (see page 4.13).

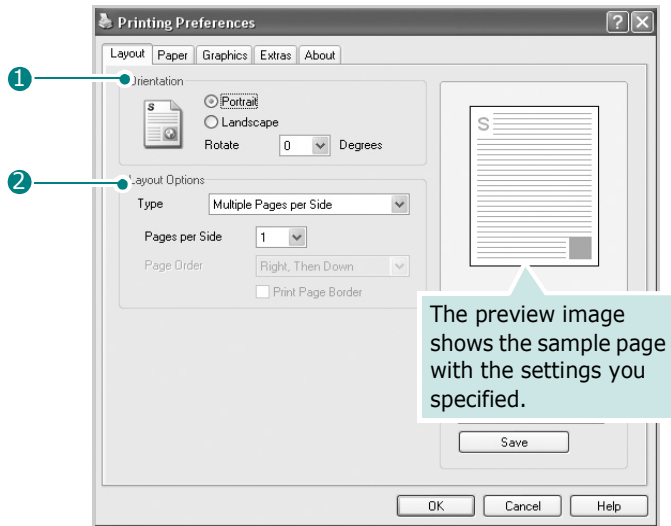





Click the **Paper** tab to access many paper properties.



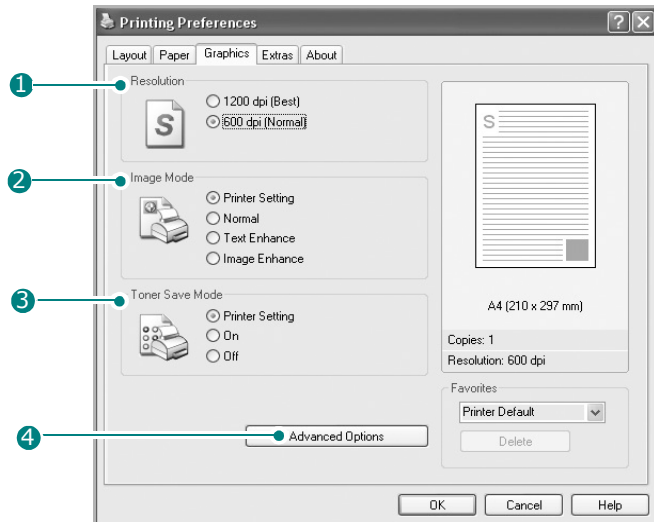



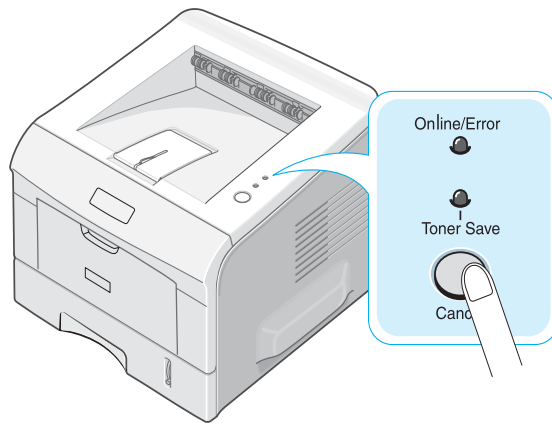
Using the Toner Save Mode

Toner Save mode allows the printer to use less toner on each page. Using this mode will extend the life of your toner cartridge and reduce your cost per page, but will reduce the print quality. This setting is not available with the 1200 dpi setting.

There are two ways to enable the Toner Save mode:

From the Control Panel

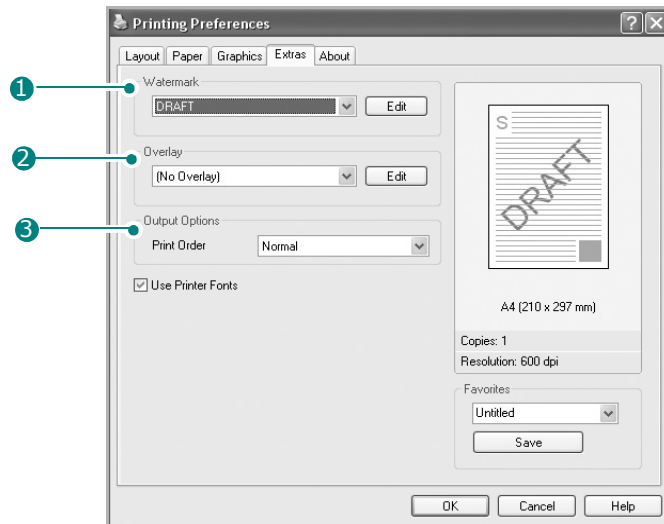
Press the Cancel button on the control panel for 0.5 second.
The printer must be in Ready mode(**Toner Save** green LED is on)



- If the **Toner Save** LED is on, the mode is enabled and the printer uses less toner to print a page.
- If the **Toner Save** LED is off, the mode is disabled and the printer prints in the normal mode.

About Tab

If you access printer properties through the **Printers** folder, you can view the **Printer** tab. Click the **Printer** tab to access the following properties:

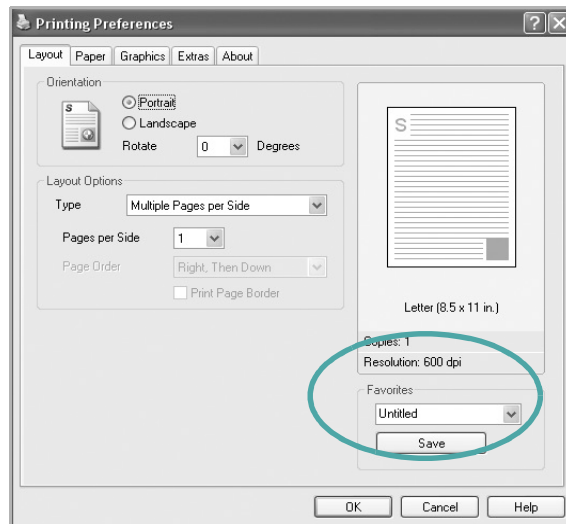
- **Optional Tray:** If you install an optional Tray 2, in the printer properties window, you can tell the machine to recognize and use it for PC-printing by selecting **Tray 2** in the **Optional Tray** drop down list.
- **High Altitude Correction:** If your machine is going to be used at an altitude above 1,500 m, checking this option will optimize the print quality for those circumstances.

Using a Favorite Setting

The **Favorites** option, available on each tab, except for the **About** tab, allows you to save the current properties settings for future use.

To save a Favorites item:

- 1 Change the settings on each tab, as needed.
- 2 Enter a name for the item in the **Favorites** input box.



- 3 Click **Save**.

To use a saved setting, select it from the **Favorites** drop-down list.

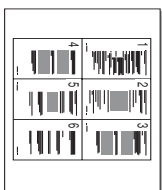
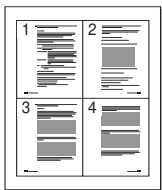

Using Help

Printing Multiple Pages on One Sheet of Paper

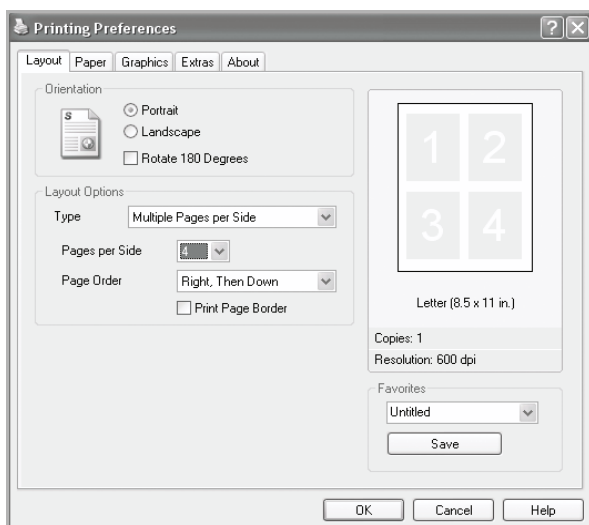
You can select the number of pages to print on a single sheet of paper. To print more than one page per sheet, the pages are reduced in size and arranged in the order you specify. You can print up to 16 pages on one sheet.

Using Watermarks

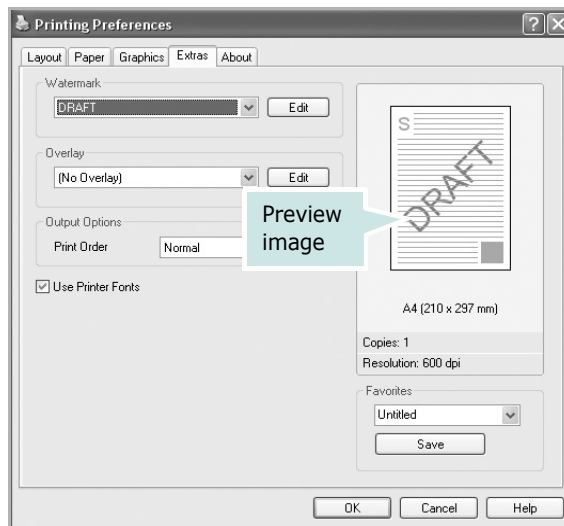


The Watermark option allows you to print text over an existing document. For example, you may want to have large gray letters reading "DRAFT" or "CONFIDENTIAL" printed diagonally across the first page or all of the pages of a document.

There are several predefined watermarks that come with your machine, and they can be modified or you can add new ones to the list.

Using an Existing Watermark

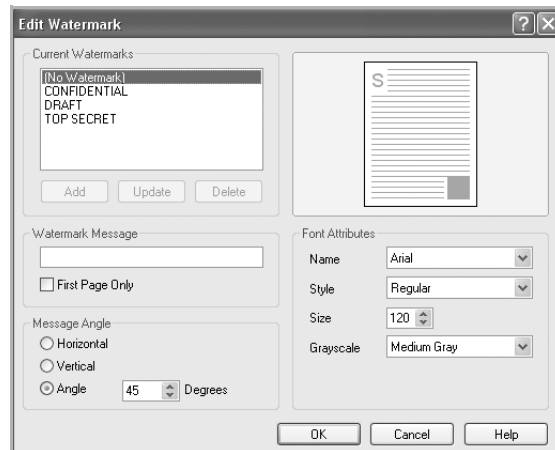

- 2 Click the **Extras** tab and click **Edit** in the **Watermark** section. The Edit Watermark window appears.



- 3 Enter the text message you want to print in the **Watermark Message** box.

The message displays in the preview image window.

When the **First Page Only** box is checked, the watermark prints on the first page only.

- 4 Select the watermark options.

You can select the font name, style, size, and gray scale level from the **Font Attributes** section and set the angle of the watermark from the **Message Angle** section.

- 5 Click **Add** to add the new watermark to the list.
- 6 When you finish creating, click **OK** and start printing.

To stop printing the watermark, select **[No Watermark]** on the **Watermark** drop-down list.

Editing a Watermark

- 2 Click the **Extras** tab and click **Edit** in the **Watermark** section. The Edit Watermark window appears.
- 3 Select the watermark you want to edit on the **Current Watermarks** list. You can change the watermark message and the options. Refer to page 4.22.
- 4 Click **Update** to save the changes.
- 5 Click **OK**.

Deleting a Watermark

- 1 To change the print settings from your software application, access printer properties. See page 4.2.
- 2 From the **Extras** tab, click **Edit** in the **Watermark** section. The Edit Watermark window appears.
- 3 Select the watermark you want to delete on the **Current Watermarks** list and click **Delete**.
- 4 Click **OK**.

Using Overlays

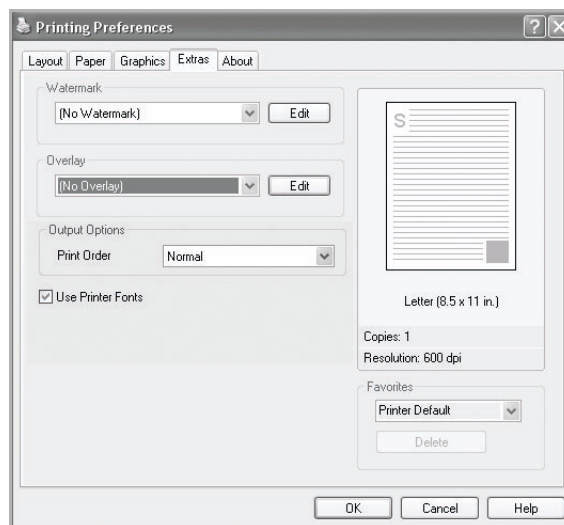
What is an Overlay?

An overlay is text and/or images stored on the computer hard disk drive (HDD) as a special file format that can be printed on any document. Overlays are often used to take the place of preprinted forms and letterhead paper. Rather than using preprinted letterhead, you can create an overlay containing the exact same information that is currently on your letterhead. To print a letter with your company's letterhead, you need only tell the machine to print the letterhead overlay on your document.

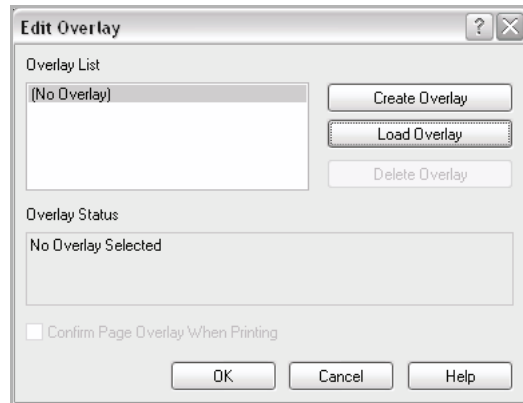
Creating a New Page Overlay

To use a page overlay, you must create a page overlay containing a logo or image.

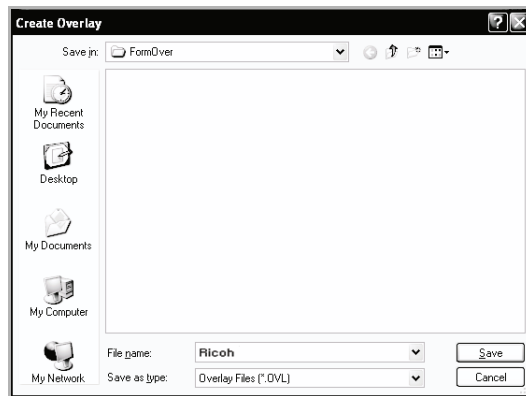
- 1 Create or open a document containing text or an image for use in a new page overlay. Position the items exactly as you wish them to appear when printed as an overlay.
- 2 To save the document as an overlay, access printer properties. See page 4.2.
- 3 Click the **Extras** tab and click **Edit** in the **Overlay** section.



- 4 In the Edit Overlay window, click **Create Overlay**.



- 5 In the Create Overlay window, type a name of up to eight characters in the **File name** box. Select the destination path, if necessary. (The default is C:\Formover).



- 6 Click **Save**. The name appears on the Overlay List.
- 7 Click **OK** or **Yes** to finish creating.

The file is not printed out. Instead it is stored in your computer HDD disk.

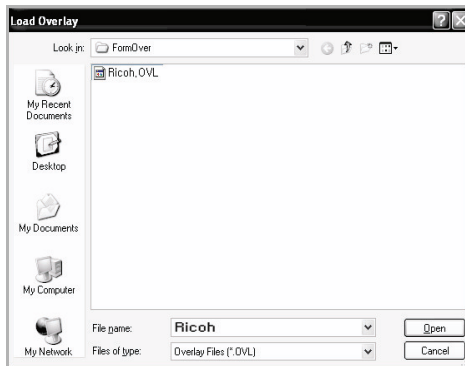


NOTE: The overlay document size must be the same as the documents you print with the overlay.

Using a Page Overlay

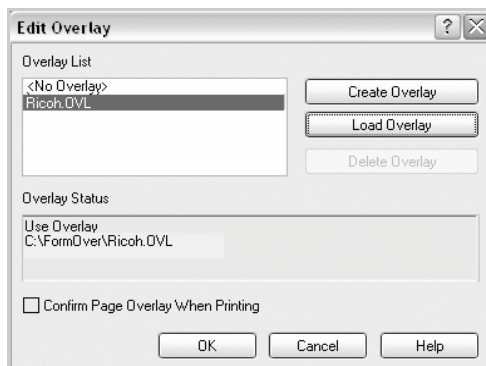
After an overlay has been created, it is ready to be printed with your document. To print an overlay with a document:

- 1 Create or open the document you want to print.
- 2 To change the print settings from your software application, access printer properties. See page 4.2.
- 3 Click the **Extras** tab.
- 4 Select the overlay you want to print from the **Overlay** drop-down list box.
- 5 If the overlay file you want doesn't appear on the Overlay List, click **Edit** and **Load Overlay**, and select the overlay file.



If you have stored the overlay file you want to use in an external source, you can also load the file when you access this Load Overlay window.

After you select the file, click **Open**. The file appears on the Overlay List and is available for printing. Select the overlay from the **Overlay List** box.



- 6** If necessary, click **Confirm Page Overlay When Printing**. When this box is checked, a message window appears each time you submit a document for printing, asking you to confirm your wish to print an overlay on the document.

Answering **Yes** in the window means that the selected overlay prints with your document. Answering **No** to the window cancels overlay printing.

If this box is empty and an overlay has been selected, the overlay will be automatically printed with your document.

- 7** Click **OK** or **Yes** until the printing starts.

The overlay downloads with your print job and prints on your document.



NOTE: The resolution of the overlay document must be the same as that of the document you will print with the overlay.

Deleting a Page Overlay

You can delete page overlays that you no longer use.

- 1** In the printer properties window, click the **Extras** tab.
- 2** Click **Edit** in the Overlay section.
- 3** Select the overlay you want to delete from the Overlay List box.
- 4** Click **Delete Overlay**.
- 5** When a confirmation message window appears, click **Yes**.
- 6** Click **OK** until you exit the Print window.

Using the Status Monitor

If an error occurs while printing, the Status Monitor window appears, showing the error.



NOTES:

- The Status Monitor program can only be used if you connect the printer to your computer with the USB cable, or on the network.
- You can use the Status Monitor in Windows 98/Me/NT 4.0/2000/XP.

Installing Status Monitor

- 1 Insert the supplied CD-ROM into your CD-ROM drive.

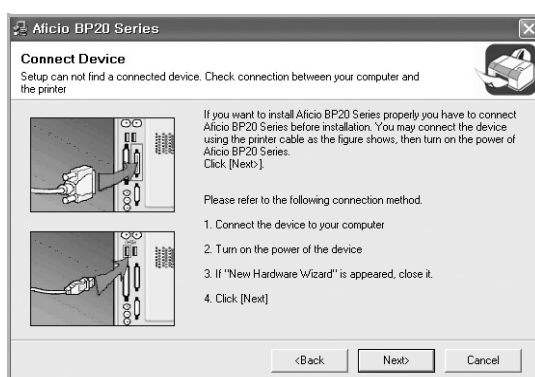
The CD-ROM should automatically run and an maintenance window appears.

If the maintenance window does not appear, click **Start** and then **Run**. Type **X:\Setup.exe**, replacing "X" with the letter of your drive and click **OK**.

- 2 Click **Next**.
- 3 Select **Custom installation**. Click **Next**.
- 4 Select your printer and click **Next**.



NOTES: If your printer is not already connected to the computer, the following window will appear.



- After connecting the printer, click **Next**.
- If you don't want to connect the printer at this time, click **Next**, and **No** on the following screen. Then the installation will start and a test page will not be printed at the end of the installation.

- 5 Click **Status Monitor** and then click **Next**.

- 6 If the test page prints out correctly, click **Yes**.
If not, click **No** to reprint it.
- 7 When the installation is completed, click **Finish**.

Reinstalling Status Monitor

- 1 From the **Start** menu, select **Programs**.
- 2 Select **Aficio BP20 Series**, and then **Maintenance**.
- 3 Click **Repair**.
- 4 Click **Status Monitor** and then click **Next**.
- 5 When reinstallation is completed, click **Finish**.

Removing Status Monitor

- 1 From the **Start** menu, select **Programs**.
- 2 Select **Aficio BP20 Series**, and then **Maintenance**.
- 3 Check **Remove**.
- 4 Click **Status Monitor** and then click **Next**.
- 5 Then your computer asks you to confirm your selection, click **Yes**.

The selected driver and all of its components are removed from your computer.
- 6 After the software is removed, click **Finish**.

Opening the Troubleshooting Guide

Double click the Status monitor icon on the Windows task bar.

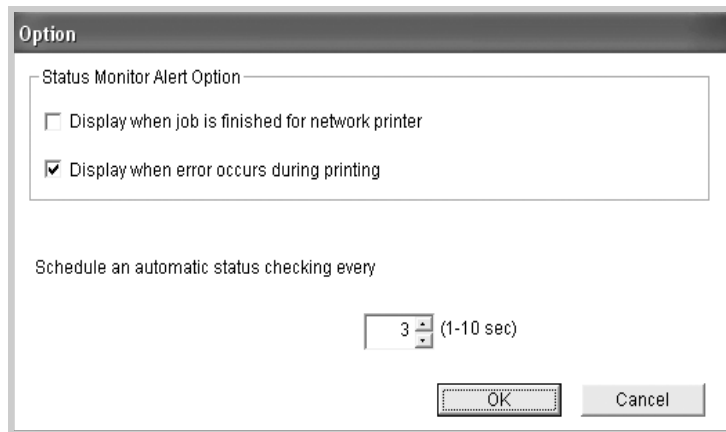
Double click this icon.



Or, From the **Start** menu, select **Programs** or **All Programs** → **Aficio BP20 Series** → **Troubleshooting guide**.

Changing the Status Monitor Program Setting

The following window opens when you click the Status monitor icon on the Windows task bar and select **Option**.



- **Display when job is finished for network printer** shows the Status monitor balloon when your job is complete.
- **Display when error occurs during printing** the Status monitor balloon appears when an error occurs while printing.
- **Schedule an automatic status checking every** allows the computer to update the printer status regularly. Setting the value close to 1 second causes the computer to check the printer status more frequently, thereby allowing a faster response to any printer error.



NOTE: When the Status monitor balloon appears to indicate an error, you can cancel the current print job or see the corresponding solution. If you select **Cancel Printing**, turn the printer off and then click **OK**. It may take several minutes. Note that this will lose data which is being sent to the printer via network.

Setting Up a Locally Shared Printer

Locally-Shared Printer

You can connect the printer directly to a selected computer, which is called the “host computer” on the network. The printer can then be shared by other users on the network through a Windows 9x/Me/XP/NT 4.0/2000 network printer connection.

Printing Across a Network

Whether the printer is locally connected or network-connected, you need to install the Aficio BP20 series printer software on each computer that will print documents to the printer.

In Windows 9x/Me

- 2 From the **Start** menu, select **Control Panel**, and double-click on the **Network** icon.
- 3 Check the **File and Print Sharing** box, and click **OK**. Close the window.

- 6 Click the **Sharing** tab and check the **Shared As** box. Fill in the **Shared Name** field and click **OK**.

Maintaining Your printer

This chapter provides suggestions for high-quality and economical printing and information for maintaining the toner cartridge and the printer.

This chapter includes:

- **Maintaining the Toner Cartridge**
- **Cleaning the Printer**
- **Printing Configuration Pages**

Maintaining the Toner Cartridge

Toner cartridge storage

To get the maximum results from the toner cartridge, keep the following guidelines in mind.

- Do not remove the toner cartridge from its package until ready for use.
- Do not refill the toner cartridge. **The printer warranty does not cover damage caused by using a refilled cartridge.**
- Store toner cartridges in the same environment as the printer.
- To prevent damage to the toner cartridge, do not expose it to light for more than a few minutes.

Toner cartridge life expectancy

The life of the toner cartridge depends on the amount of toner that print jobs require. When printing text at ISO 19752 5% coverage, a new toner cartridge lasts an average of 5,000 pages. (The original toner cartridge supplied with the machine lasts an average of 3,500 pages.) The actual number may be different depending on the print density of the page you print. If you print a lot of graphics, you may need to change the cartridge more often.

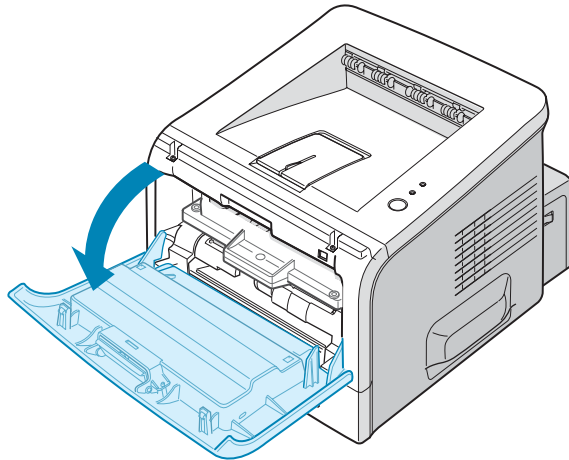
Saving toner

To save toner, press the **Cancel** button on the printer control panel for 0.5 second. The button will be lit. You can also enable the Toner Save in the printer properties. Refer to "Using the Toner Save Mode" on page 4.11. Selecting this option will extend the life of the toner cartridge and reduce your cost per page, but will reduce the print quality.

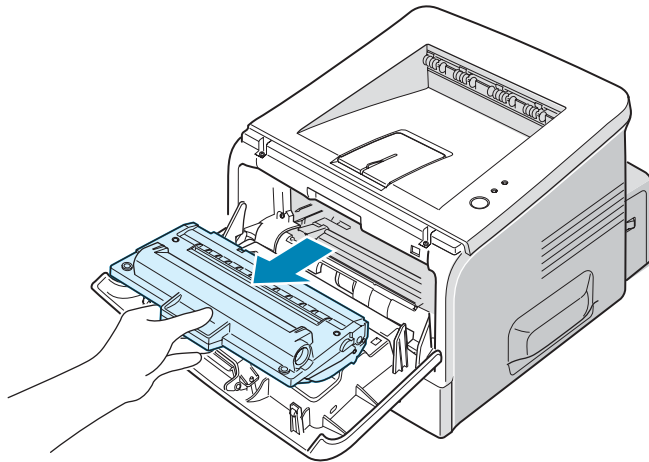
Redistributing Toner

When toner is low, faded or light areas may appear on a printed page. You may be able to temporarily improve the print quality by redistributing the toner. The following procedures may allow you to finish the current print job before replacing the toner cartridge.

- 1 Grasp the front cover and pull it toward you to open.



- 2 Pull the toner cartridge and remove it from the printer.

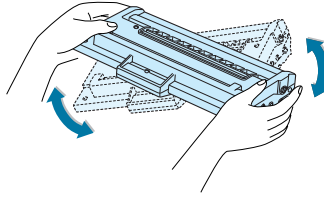


CAUTION: Avoid reaching too far into the printer. The fusing area may be hot.



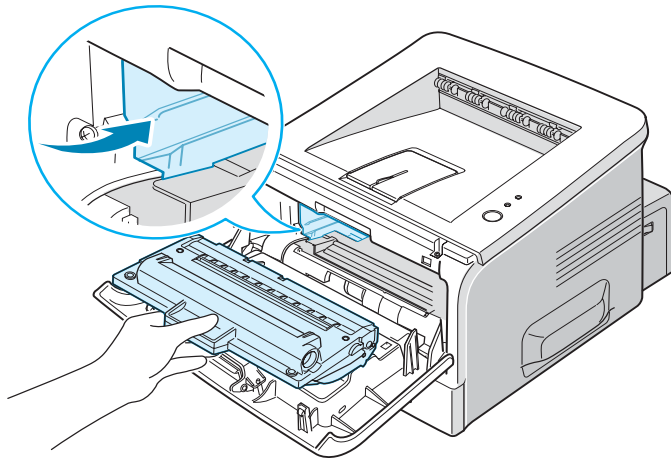
NOTE: To prevent damage to the toner cartridge, do not expose it to light for more than a few minutes. Cover it with a piece of paper, if left exposed for more than a few minutes and keep it in a flat and clean place.

- 3** Gently shake the toner cartridge from side to side five or six times to redistribute the toner.

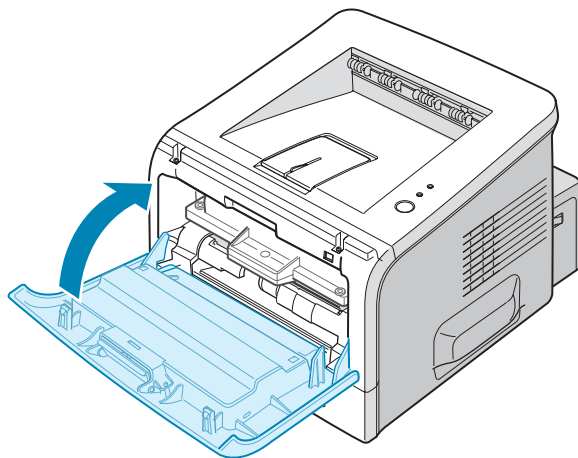


NOTE: If toner gets on your clothing, wipe it off with a dry cloth and wash clothing in cold water. Hot water sets toner into fabric.

- 4** Reinsert the toner cartridge into the printer. Ensure that the toner cartridge snaps into place.



- 5** Close the front cover. Make sure that the cover is securely closed. If it is not firmly closed, printing errors may occur when you print.



Replacing the Toner Cartridge

If the print remains light after redistributing the toner (see page 5.3), replace the toner cartridge.

Remove the old cartridge and install a new toner cartridge. See "Installing the Toner Cartridge" on page 2.4.

Cleaning the Printer

To maintain print quality, follow the cleaning procedures below each time the toner cartridge is replaced or if print quality problems occur.



NOTES:

- While cleaning the inside of the printer, be careful not to touch the transfer roller (located underneath the toner cartridge). Oil from your fingers can cause print quality problems.
- Cleaning the cabinet of the printer with surfactants containing large amounts of alcohol, solvent, or other strong substances can discolor or crack the cabinet.

Cleaning the Outside

Clean the cabinet of the printer with a soft, lint-free cloth. You can dampen the cloth slightly with water, but be careful not to let any water drip onto the printer or inside of it.

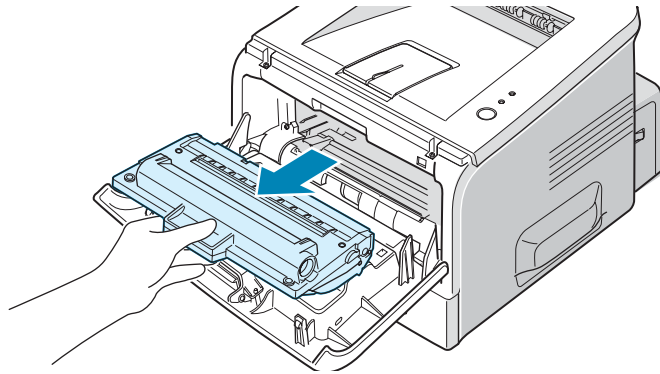
Cleaning the Inside

During the printing process, paper, toner, and dust particles can accumulate inside the printer. This buildup can cause print quality problems, such as toner specks or smearing. Cleaning the inside of the printer will eliminate or reduce these problems.

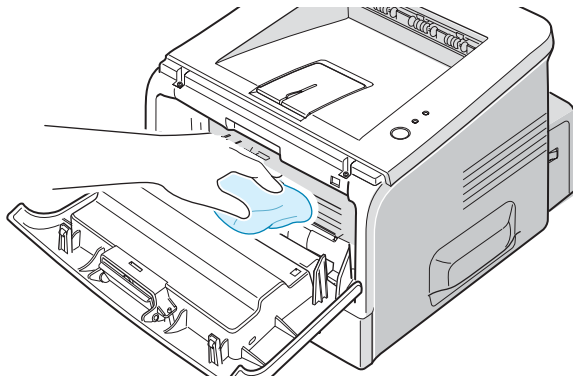
Cleaning inside the printer

- 1 Turn the printer off and unplug the power cord, then wait for the printer to cool.

- 2 Open the front cover. Pull the toner cartridge and remove it from the printer.

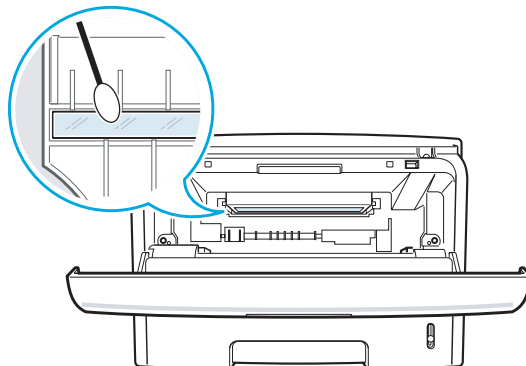


- 3 With a dry, lint-free cloth, wipe away any dust and spilled toner from the toner cartridge area and the toner cartridge cavity.

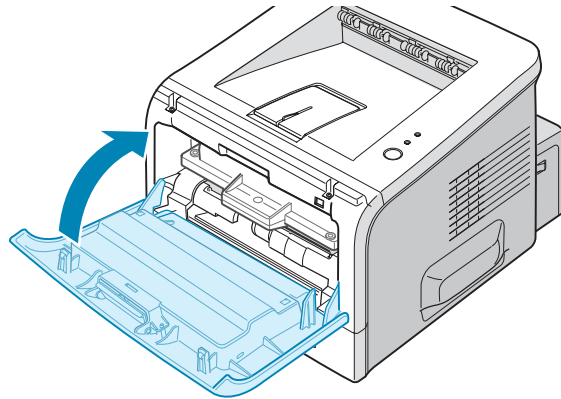


NOTE: To prevent damage to the toner cartridge, do not expose it to light for more than a few minutes. Cover it with a piece of paper, if necessary and keep it in a flat and clean place. Also, do not touch the black transfer roller inside the printer.

- 4 Locate the long strip of glass (LSU) inside the top of the cartridge compartment, and gently swab the glass to see if dirt turns the white cotton black.



- 5 Reinsert the toner cartridge and close the cover. Make sure that the cover is securely closed. If it is not firmly closed, printing errors may occur when you print.



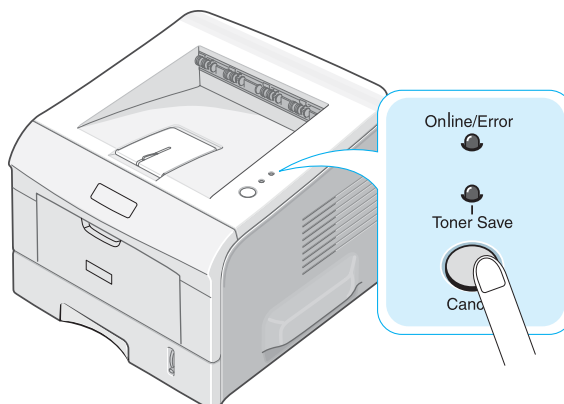
- 6 Plug in the power cord, and turn the printer on.

Printing a cleaning sheet

Your printer can be set to print out a cleaning sheet automatically every 500 print pages. you should use this feature if you use inferior quality paper, because such paper may lower print quality. See page A.6. This feature activates as a default depending on the country.

If you are experiencing blurred, faded, or smeared printouts, printing a cleaning sheet will clean the drum inside the toner cartridge. This process will produce a page with toner debris, which should be discarded.

- 1 Ensure that the printer is turned on and in the Ready mode with paper loaded in the tray.
- 2 Press and hold down the **Cancel** button on the control panel for about 10 seconds.



- 3 Your printer automatically picks up a sheet of paper from the tray and prints out a cleaning sheet with dust or toner particles on it.



NOTE: The cartridge cleaning process takes some time. To stop the process, turn the power off.

Printing Configuration Pages

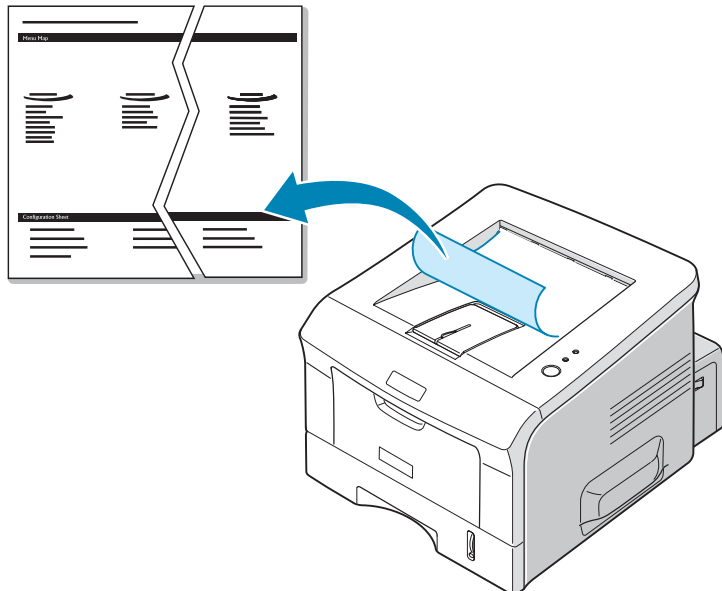
From the printer's control panel, you can print a Configuration page. Use the configuration page to view current printer settings, to help troubleshoot printer problems, or to verify installation of optional accessories, such as memory, optional tray, and printer languages.

If your printer has a network card, the network configuration sheet prints out with a printer configuration sheet.

To print configuration pages:

- 1 Ensure that the printer is turned on and in the Ready mode with paper loaded in the tray.
- 2 Press and hold down the **Cancel** button on the control panel for about 6 seconds.

For problems with the operation of your printer, refer to the following table for suggested solutions.

Clearing Paper Jams

Occasionally, paper can jam during a print job. Some causes include:

- The tray is loaded improperly or overfilled.
- The tray has been pulled out during a print job.
- The front cover has been opened during a print job.
- Paper that does not meet paper specifications has been used. See "Paper Specifications" on page C.3.
- Paper that is outside of the supported size range has been used. See "Paper Specifications" on page C.3.

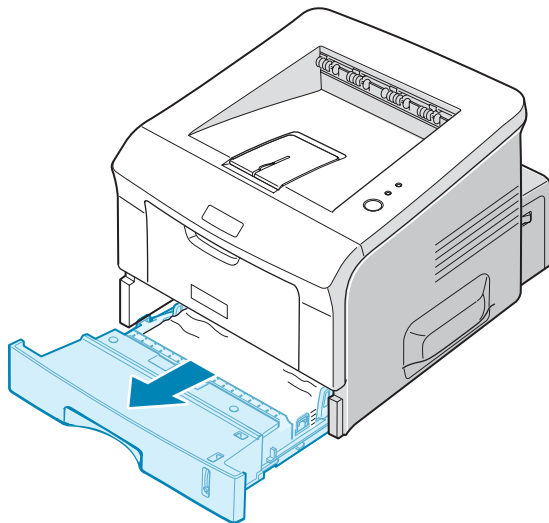
If a paper jam occurs, the **Online/Error** LED on the control panel lights red. Find and remove the jammed paper. If you can't see it, look inside the printer.



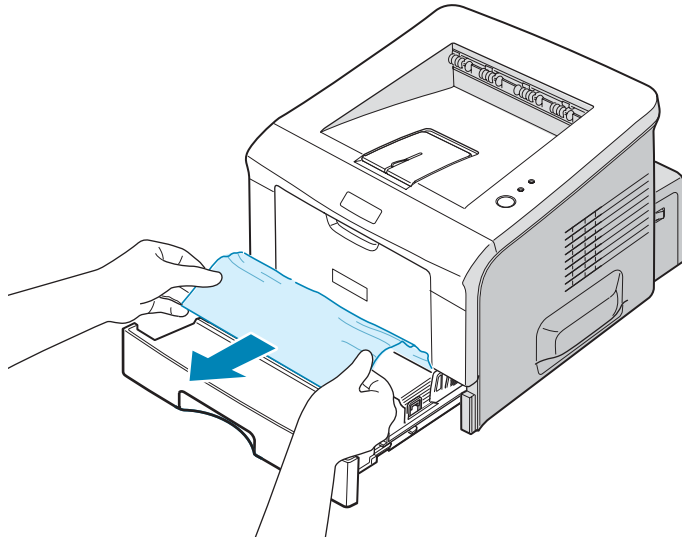
NOTE: Do not use tweezers or metal objects with sharp ends when you remove paper jams. If you do this, it may damage the metal parts inside of your machine and cause a short circuit.



If the inside of the printer is dirty, or paper is improperly loaded, print quality maybe reduced. See the table below to troubleshoot the problem.

Problem	Solution

Also try rotating the paper 180° in the tray.
<p>Back of printouts are dirty</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The transfer roller may be dirty. "Cleaning the Inside" on page 5.5. • Check for leaking toner. Clean the inside of the printer.
<p>Black pages</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The toner cartridge may not be installed properly. Remove the cartridge and reinsert. • The toner cartridge may be defective and need replacing. Install a new toner cartridge. • The printer may require repair. Contact a service representative.
<p>Loose toner</p> 	<p>Clean the inside of the printer.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check the paper type and quality. See "Paper Specifications" on page C.3. • Install a new toner cartridge. See "Installing the Toner Cartridge" on page 2.4. • If the problem persists, the printer may require repair. 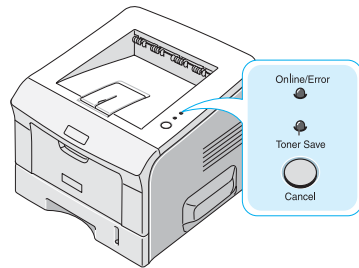

About the Remote Control Panel

DOS users have access to many printer features through specific DOS printer drivers; however, many software manufacturers do not develop printer drivers for their software programmes. Your printer provides the software control panel for improved printer control when DOS printer drivers are not available or when certain print settings are not available through DOS software programmes.



NOTE: The printer's Remote Control Panel is not a printer driver. It should be used to set print settings that are not available through DOS software programmes. Printer drivers are supplied by the manufacturers of your DOS software programmes. If your DOS software Programme does not include a printer driver for your printer, contact the manufacturer of the software or use one of the alternate printer drivers.

Installing the Remote Control Panel

- 1 Insert the supplied CD-ROM into your CD-ROM drive.

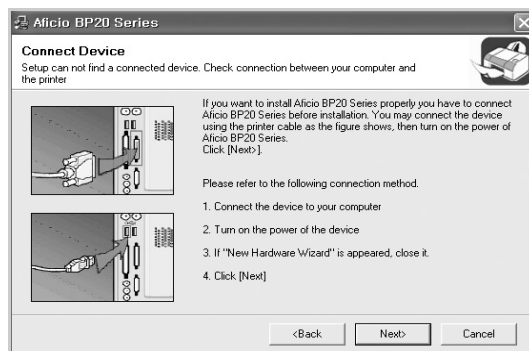

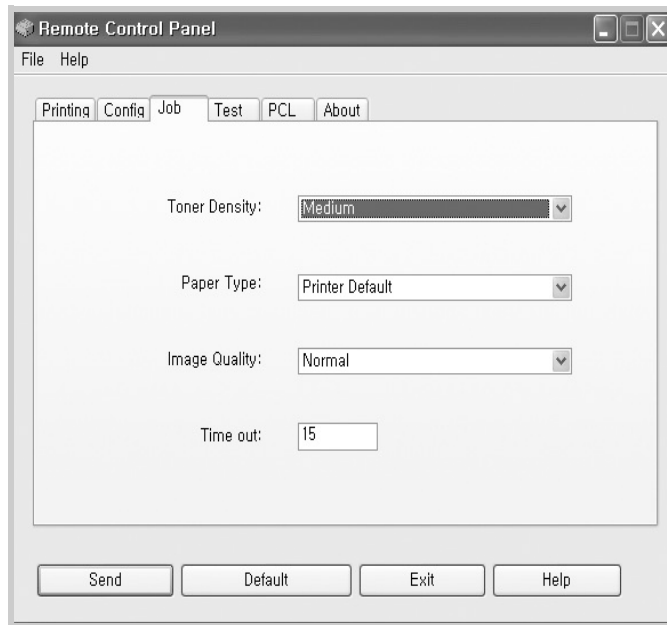
You can configure various printer features.



- **Emulation** selects the emulation for printing a document. The factory default is **Auto**.
- **Power Save** determines the length of time the printer waits after a job is printed before it goes to a reduced power state. If the printer is used frequently, select **OFF** which keeps the printer ready to print with the minimum warm-up time. This uses more power to keep the printer warm and ready to print.
- **Auto Continue** determines what action the printer should take if the Multi-Purpose Tray is empty when a manual feed print job is sent to the printer. If it is checked, the printer will pick up the paper from the tray 1 after fifteen seconds. Otherwise, the printer will wait for you to load paper in the Multi-Purpose Tray.
- **Jam Recovery** determines what action the printer should take when a paper jam occurs. If it is unchecked, the printer does not reprint a page that has jammed. If it is checked, the printer keeps the image in memory for a printed page until the printer signals that the page has successfully printed. The printer reprints all jammed pages.
- **Toner save** determines the toner quantity the printer should use when printing. If it is checked, the printer conserves toner when printing. The default value is unchecked, which provides 100% usage.

Job Tab

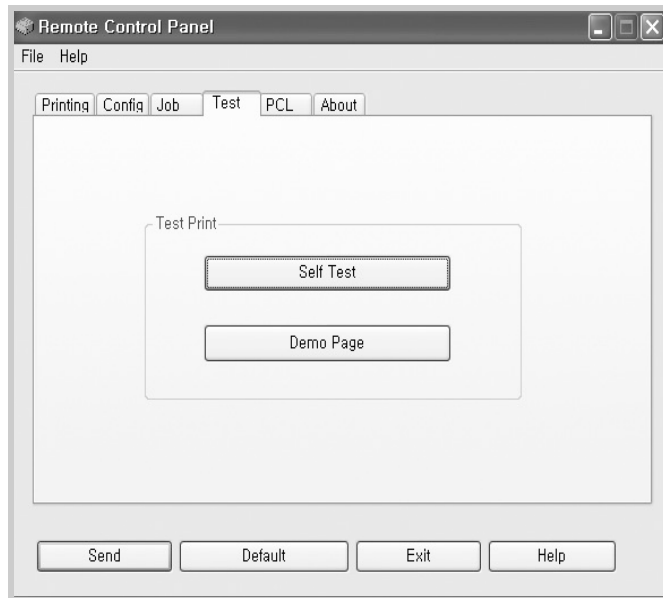
You can set options for improving the quality of your print job.



- **Toner Density** determines the toner density of the page. The default value is **Medium**.
- **Paper Type** provides the printer with information about the type of paper to be used for a print job. For the best result, set this to the paper type you loaded in the tray of the printer. When using plain paper, set this to **Printer Default**.
- **Image Quality** improves the print quality of your text and image and make the characters and images appear smoother. It is preset to **Normal** at the factory.
- **Time out** determines the amount of time (in seconds) the printer will wait before printing the last page of a print job that does not end with a command to print the page or a formfeed character. You can set from 0 to 300 seconds.

Test Tab

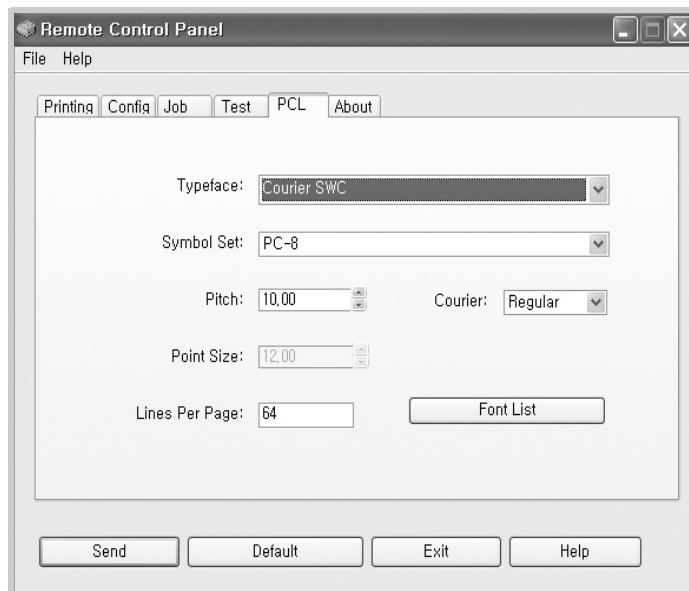
This tab allows you to print a resident page to test your printer's performance.



- **Self Test** prints a configuration sheet. A list of the user default settings and the amount of printer memory available prints.
- **Demo Page** prints a demonstration page. It shows the printer features and specifications.

PCL Tab

In this tab, you can configure various settings for PCL emulation.



- **Typeface** allows you to select the desired typeface. This setting is ignored when the software application specifies a font.
- **Symbol Set** determines the symbol set. A symbol set is a set of alphabetic and numeric characters, punctuation, and special symbols used when printing with a selected font.
- **Pitch** sets the font pitch (only if you have selected a scalable monospaced font). Pitch refers to the number of fixed-space characters in one horizontal inch of type.
- **Point Size** sets the font point size (only if you have selected a scalable typographic font). Point size refers to the height of the characters in the font. One point equals approximately 1/72 of an inch. You can select point sizes from 4.0 to 999.75 in increments of 0.25 points.
- **Lines Per Page** sets the number of lines that print on each page. The setting can range from 5 to 128 lines per page.
- **Courier** determines the courier font type; **Regular** or **Dark**.
- **Font List** prints a font list showing all the fonts available for PCL emulation.

Your printer is a full-featured laser printer that has been optimised to meet most of your printing needs. Recognizing that each user may have different requirements, however, Ricoh makes several options available to enhance the printer's capabilities.

Precautions When Installing Printer Options

DISCONNECT THE POWER CORD:

Never remove the printer control board while the printer is plugged in.

To avoid the possibility of an electrical shock, always disconnect the power cord when installing or removing ANY internal or external printer option.

DISCHARGE STATIC ELECTRICITY:

The control board and internal printer option (Memory) are sensitive to static electricity. Before installing or removing an internal option, discharge static electricity from your body by touching something metal, such as the metal back plate on any device plugged into a grounded power source. If you walk round before finishing installation, discharge any static electricity once again.

Properties, such as weight, composition, grain, and moisture content, are important factors affecting the printer's performance and the output quality. Paper that does not meet the guidelines outlined in this User's Guide can cause the following problems:

- Poor print quality
- Increased paper jams
- Premature wear on the printer.



NOTES:

- Some paper may meet all of the guidelines in this guide and still not produce satisfactory results. This may be the result of improper handling, unacceptable temperature and humidity levels, or other variables over which manufacturer has no control.
 - Before purchasing large quantities of paper, ensure that the paper meets the requirements specified in this User's Guide.
 - Using paper that does not meet these specifications may cause problems, requiring repairs. These repairs are not covered by the manufacturer's warranty or service agreements.

Guidelines for Using Paper

For the best result, use conventional 75 g/m² (20 lb) paper. Ensure that the paper is of good quality, and free of cuts, nicks, tears, spots, loose particles, dust, wrinkles, voids, and curled or bent edges.

If you are unsure of what type of paper you are loading, such as bond or recycled paper, check the label on the package.

The following problems may cause print quality deviations, jamming, or even damage to the printer.

Symptom	Problem with Paper	Solution
Poor print quality or toner adhesion, problems with feeding	Too moist, too rough, too smooth, or embossed; faulty paper lot	Try another kind of paper, between 100 ~ 250 Sheffield, 4 ~ 5 % moisture content.

Printer and Paper Storage Environment

Paper storage environment conditions directly affect the feed operation.

Ideally, the printer and paper storage environment should be at or near room temperature, and not too dry or humid. Remember that paper is hygroscopic; it absorbs and loses moisture rapidly.

Heat works with humidity to damage paper. Heat causes the moisture in paper to evaporate, while cold causes it to condense on the sheets. Heating systems and air conditioners remove most of the humidity from a room. As paper is opened and used, it loses moisture, causing streaks and smudging. Humid weather or water coolers can cause the humidity to increase in a room. As paper is opened and used it absorbs any excess moisture, causing light print and dropouts. Also, as paper loses and gains moisture it can become distorted. This can cause paper jams.

Care should be taken not to purchase more paper than can be used in a short time (about 3 months). Paper stored for long periods may experience heat and moisture extremes, which can cause damage. Planning is important to prevent damage to large supplies of paper.

Unopened paper in sealed reams can remain stable for several months before use. Opened packages of paper have more potential for environment damage, especially if they are not wrapped with a moisture-proof barrier.

The paper storage environment should be properly maintained to ensure optimum printer performance. The optimum condition is 20° to 24°C (68° to 75°F), with a relative humidity of 45% to 55%. The following guidelines should be considered when evaluating the paper's storage environment:

- Paper should be stored at or near room temperature.
- The air should not be too dry or too humid.
- The best way to store an opened ream of paper is to rewrap it tightly in its moisture-proof wrapping. If the printer environment is subject to extremes, unwrap only the amount of paper to be used during the day's operation to prevent unwanted moisture changes.

Envelopes

Envelope construction is critical. Envelope fold lines can vary considerably, not only between manufacturers, but also within a box from the same manufacturer. Successful printing on envelopes depends upon the quality of the envelopes. When selecting envelopes, consider the following components:

- **Weight:** The weight of the envelope paper should not exceed 90 g/m² (24 lb) or jamming may occur.
- **Construction:** Prior to printing, envelopes should lie flat with less than 6 mm (0.25 in.) curl, and should not contain air.
- **Condition:** Envelopes should not be wrinkled, nicked, or otherwise damaged.
- **Temperature:** You should use envelopes that are compatible with the heat and pressure of the printer.
- **Size:** You should only use envelopes within the following size ranges.

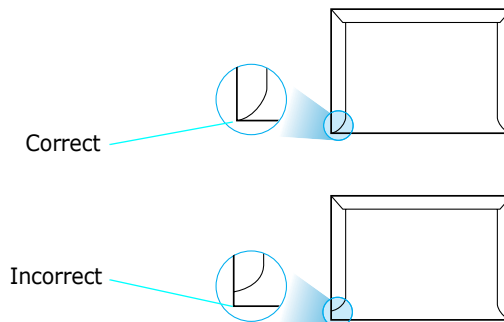


NOTES:

- Use only the Multi-Purpose Tray to print envelopes.
 - You may experience some paper jams when using any media with a length less than 127 mm (5.0 in.). This may be caused by paper that has been affected by environmental conditions. For optimum performance, make sure you are storing and handling the paper correctly. Please refer to "Printer and Paper Storage Environment" on page C.7.

Envelopes with Double Side Seams

Double side-seam construction has vertical seams at both ends of the envelope rather than diagonal seams. This style may be more likely to wrinkle. Be sure the seam extends all the way to the corner of the envelope as illustrated below.



Envelopes with Adhesive Strips or Flaps

Envelopes with a peel-off adhesive strip or with more than one flap that folds over to seal must use adhesives compatible with the heat and pressure in the printer. The extra flaps and strips might cause wrinkling, creasing, or even jams and may even damage the fuser.

Envelope Margins

The following gives typical address margins for a commercial #10 or DL envelope.

Type of Address	Minimum	Maximum
Return address	15 mm (0.6 in.)	51 mm (2 in.)
Delivery address	51 mm (2 in.)	89 mm (3.5 in.)



NOTES:

- For best print quality, position margins no closer than 15 mm (0.6 in.) from the edges of the envelope.
- Avoid printing over the area where the envelope's seams meet.

Envelope Storage

Proper storage of envelopes helps contribute to print quality. Envelopes should be stored flat. If air is trapped in an envelope, creating an air bubble, then the envelope may wrinkle during printing. See "Printing on Envelopes" on page 3.14.

Labels



NOTES:

- To avoid damaging the printer, use only labels recommended for laser printers.
 - To prevent serious jams, always use the Multi-Purpose Tray to print labels and always use the rear output tray.
 - Never print on the same sheet of labels more than once and never print on a partial sheet of labels.
-

When selecting labels, consider the quality of each component:

- Adhesives: The adhesive material should be stable at 200 °C (392 °F), the printer's fusing temperature.
- Arrangement: Only use labels with no exposed backing between them. Labels can peel off sheets with spaces between the labels, causing serious jams.
- Curl: Prior to printing, labels must lie flat with no more than 13 mm (5 in.) of curl in any direction.
- Condition: Do not use labels with wrinkles, bubbles, or other indications of separation.

Transparencies

Transparencies used in the printer must be able to withstand 170 °C (338 °F), the printer's fusing temperature.



NOTE: To avoid damaging the printer, use only transparencies recommended for use in laser printers.

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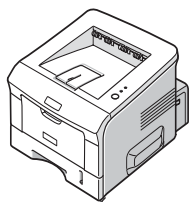
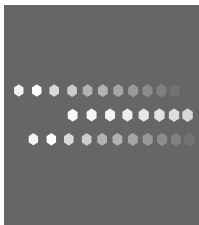
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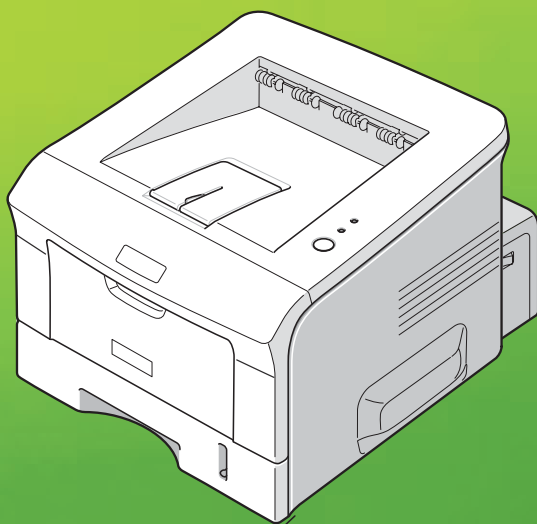

- Select **[Local Printer]**, uncheck the box labelled **[Automatically detect and install my Plug and Play printer.]** and then select **[Next]** to display the dialog box listing available ports.

- Select **[Create a new port]** to display the **Printer Ports** dialog box.

Select **[Standard TCP/IP Port]** and select **[Next]** to display the Add Standard TCP/IP Port dialog box.

Enter the IP Address of the printer in the **[Printer Name or IP Address]** field (you can optionally enter a friendly name for the printer port you are creating or use the default name created). Then select **[Next]** to continue.

If the network printer settings are not automatically detected, click on the **[Custom]** button to setup the network printer port settings.

It is recommended that you select **[RAW]** as the Print Protocol.

Enter **[lp]** (in lower case) in the **[LPR print queue]** field.

Uncheck the box labelled **[LPR Byte Counting Enabled]**

Check the box labelled **[SNMP Status Enabled]**.

The **[Community Name]** should normally be set to "public" (unless you have configured the device to have a custom SNMP community name) and the **[SNMP Device Index]** should be set to 1.

Select **[OK]**.

- The Add Printer Wizard will then request that you select the driver to be used for this printer.

Insert the CD ROM with the printer drivers into the workstation and select **[Have Disk]**.

Browse to the required Windows 2000 driver on the CDROM and select **[OK]**.

Port Configuration

You can invoke Configure Multi Direct Print Type S IPP port dialog from Printer Properties.

Multi Direct Print Type S IPP port configuration dialog has three pages:

- Common
- Job Template Attributes
- Groups

Common page

In this page you can specify:

- Port Name (it should be done when you create the port, and it can not be changed subsequently)
- The printer or group of printers you want to print on.

Port Name should be unique among all ports.

You have two alternative ways to specify printer (or printers) location:

- To associate the port with a single printer, you should select **[Single Printer]** option and type the printer 's URL in **[URL]** edit box. If authentication is obligatory, you should check **[Printer requires authentication]** checkbox and enter username and password in corresponding edit boxes.
- In case of multi-remote printing (when all you documents are printed on several printers simultaneously) you should select **[Multi-remote Printing]** option and point out printers groups. Printers groups are managed in **[Groups]** page.

“Job Template Attributes ” page

In this page you can specify job attributes, they will be applied to any job printed with this port.

These attributes describe job processing behavior.

Property	Description
Priority	This attribute specifies a priority for scheduling the job. A higher value specifies a higher priority.
Resolution	This attribute identifies the resolution that printer uses for the document.

Property	Description
Hold Until	This attribute specifies the named time period during which the job must become a candidate for printing.
Quality	This attribute specifies the print quality that the printer uses for the job.
Sides	This attribute specifies how print-stream pages are to be imposed upon the sides of an impression.
Finishings	This attribute identifies the finishing operations that the printer uses for printed documents (e.g.stapling or punching).
Page Range	This attribute identifies the range(s)of print-stream pages that the printer uses for each copy of each document which are to be printed.
Copies	This attribute specifies the number of copies to be printed.
Paper	This attribute identifies the medium that the printer uses for all impressions of the document.
Orientation	This attribute indicates the desired orientation for printed documents.
Pages per Sheet	This attribute specifies the number of print-stream pages to impose upon a single side of an instance of a selected medium.
Print job sheet	This attribute indicates whether the sheet with job information should be printed.
All attributes are mandatory	If checked, instructs the printer not to print a job if the printer does not support any of selected attributes. If unchecked, orders printer to produce output regardless of unsupported attributes.

For more details, refer to RFCs 2911, section 4.2

“Groups ” page

In this page you can manage printer groups, which are used for multi-remote printing.

To create a new group you should select upper level group and press **[New group]** button, or click the right mouse button and select **[New] → [Group]** in pop--up menu. Then, enter a group name.

You can move printer or group to another group using drag-and- drop operations. If you press and hold “Ctrl” key while dropping, object will be not moved but copied.

To add a printer to a group, you should select this group and press **[New Printer ...]** button. This also can be done from pop-up menu. Some dialog will appear:

In New Printer Properties dialog, you should specify:

- The name for new printer (it will be used in “groups ” tree));
- Printer URL;
- Authentication parameters (if needed).

Patterns allow you to fill these parameters automatically. The patterns are taken from Multi Direct Print Type S IPP ports configurations. For instance, if you have an Multi Direct Print Type S IPP port, which is configured for a single printer, you can create a printer in **[groups]** tree with the same parameters (including the authentication name and the password).

To delete a printer or a group, press **[Delete]** button or select **[Delete]** in pop--up menu.

To change printer properties, press **[Properties ...]** button or select **[Properties]** in pop--up menu.⁶

Test Print

To ensure the printer has been installed on the network correctly a test print should be submitted from a client workstation. Perform the following steps:

- **1** Open a document on a client workstation.
- **2** Select the *Aficio BP20N* as the printer for sending documents to.
- **3** Print the document on the device and verify that it prints correctly.
- **4** Ensure the print driver is installed on every workstation that will be sending jobs to the device.
- **5** Repeat the test for all workstations that will be sending jobs to the device.

Using Web Aficio BP20N

Introduction

Web Aficio BP20N uses the embedded HTTP Server on the *Aficio BP20N* to allow communication with the *Aficio BP20N* if you have a Web Browser with access to the Internet or Intranet. By entering the IP Address of the *Aficio BP20N* as the URL (Universal Resource Locator) in the Browser, direct access to the *Aficio BP20N* is available.

NOTE: Microsoft Internet Explorer version 4.x or later should be used. Other browsers may work, but could produce unexpected results.

Many of the selections and settings needed to install *Aficio BP20N* on a network can be made using Internet Services, eliminating steps that would otherwise need to be performed at the *Aficio BP20N* Control Panel.

Many of the features available within Internet Services will require an admin user name and password. A user will only be prompted for an admin name and password once in a single browser session.

Before the Internet Services feature can be used for installing *Aficio BP20N* on a network it must be enabled. There are two stages required to enable Internet Services:

➤ Network Communication Setup

This requires the *Aficio BP20N* to be set up for Internet Services.

➤ Enable Internet Services

➤ Make settings to the appropriate network

NOTE: When making more than one configuration change please complete all the changes in one go and then carry out a reboot.

Network Communication Setup

Network Communication Setup requires that the *Aficio BP20N* is connected to the network, that the TCP/IP address settings are made(see User's Guide "Using Set IP(BP20N only)"on page 2.31~2.33)

Make sure that these procedures have been carried out.

Enabling Internet Services

1

- At a client workstation on the network, launch the Internet Browser.

2

- In the URL field, enter `http://` followed by the IP Address of the *Aficio BP20N*. Then pressed the **[Enter]** key.

Example: If the IP Address is 192.168.100.100, enter the following in the URL field:

http://192.168.100.100
```


Configuring the Network

Web Aficio BP20N provides an alternative method of configuring the device settings in order to successfully complete installation on a network.

This procedure explains how to use Web Aficio BP20N to configure the device.

- Test Print

A print job should be submitted to ensure the device has been installed and configured correctly.

Configure the Aficio BP20N

NOTE: The TCP/IP settings for the device will have been set up when completing the *Enabling Web Aficio BP20N* section.

To complete the installation of the device, perform these steps:

- Enable Web Aficio BP20N (see “*Enabling Internet Services*” on page 3-5).
- At the Web Aficio BP20N Home Page for the *Aficio BP20N*, select the **[Network Administrator]** tab.
- Click **TCP/IP** menu in the left frame.
- Check if the **TCP/IP Configuration** details are correct. If any of the details are incorrect then enter the correct information.

Choose the **[IP Address Assignment Method]** required.

NOTE: DHCP automatically assigns IP addresses and is the default setting. If the IP Address needs to be edited but is unavailable, select IP Address Assignment Method and then Static to continue.

Enter the **[IP Address]**.

Enter the **[Subnet Mask]**.

Enter the **[Gateway Address]**.

- 6** ➤ Check the **DDNS Address** and **DDNS Domain** details and if necessary enter the correct information required.
- 7** ➤ Click the **[Apply]** button to implement any changes.

NOTE: Click the **[Reset]** button to cancel any changes made and return to the previous values.

Test Print

To ensure the device has been installed on the network correctly a test print should be submitted from a client workstation. Perform the following steps:

- 1** ➤ Open a document on a client workstation.
- 2** ➤ Select the device as the printer to which the selected document will be sent.
- 3** ➤ Print the document on the device and verify that it prints correctly.
- 4** ➤ Ensure the driver is installed on every workstation that will be sending jobs to the device.
- 5** ➤ Repeat the test for all workstations that will be sending jobs to the device.
- 6** ➤ The installation process is now complete.

Use these instructions to configure the Simple Network Management Protocol (SNMP) using Aficio BP20N.

Configure SNMP
