Available Options

A CAUTION:





PAPER FEED UNIT Type 5000

Preparation

When installing multiple options, install the Paper Feed Unit first.

Two people are needed to install the Paper Feed Unit. Start the installation with two people.

Up to two Paper Feed Units can be installed to the printer. When installing two units, connect the two units by following the procedure for connecting the unit and the printer. Then, place the printer on the connected two Paper Feed Units.


↑ CAUTION:

- When moving the machine, each person should hold the handles that are located on opposite sides, and then lift it slowly. Lifting it carelessly or dropping it may cause an injury.
- When moving the Paper Feed Unit, hold the handles that are located on the top of the unit, and then lift it slowly. Lifting it carelessly or dropping it may cause an injury.
