# Powering On/Off the Projector

### **Powering On the Projector**

- 1. Ensure that the power cord and signal cable are securely connected. The Power indicator will turn red.
- 2. Remove the lens cap. **①**
- 3. Turn on the lamp by pressing "Power" on the control panel or the remote control. 2 The Power indicator will flash blue. The startup screen will display in approximately 5 seconds. After the screen disappears, the Power indicator will turn blue.

The first time you use the projector after purchase, the language menu is displayed after the startup screen. (See page 37)

4. Turn on your source (computer, notebook, video player, etc.) The projector will detect your source automatically.



### **Powering Off the Projector**

1. Press the "Power" and you will see a message as below on the on-screen display.



- 2. Press the "Power" again to turn off the projector lamp.
- 3. The cooling fan continues to operate for about 60 seconds for cooling cycle and the Power indicator will flash red. After cooling down, the light stops flashing, and then the projector will enter the standby mode. If you wish to turn the projector back on, you must wait until the projector has completed the cooling cycle and has entered standby mode. Once in standby mode, simply press "Power" to restart the projector.
- 4. Disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet and the projector.

### **Warning Indicator**

When the "Temp" indicator lights red, it indicates the projector has overheated. The projector will automatically shut itself down.



When the "Lamp" indicator lights red, and you see the message below displays on-screen, the projector has detected that the lamp is approaching its end of life. Please change the lamp as soon as possible or contact your local dealer or our service center.




When the "Temp" indicator flashes red (0.5 sec on, 0.5 secs off) and the message below displays on-screen, it indicates the fan failed. Stop using the projector and disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet, then contact your local dealer or our service center.

1. Use **1** to fine-tune the display angle.






You can raise the projector front up to 7 degrees by rotating the adjustable feet.


You may turn the zoom lever to zoom in or out. To focus the image, rotate the focus ring until the image is clear.

## Using the On Screen Display (OSD)

The Projector has a multilingual On Screen Display that allows you to make image adjustments and change a variety of settings.


### How to operate

- 1. To open the OSD, press "Menu" on the Control Panel or Remote Control.
- 2. When OSD is displayed, use ▲ ▼ keys to select any item in the main menu. While making a selection on a particular page, press key to enter sub menu.
- 3. Use \(\times\) \(\neg \) keys to select the desired item in the sub menu and press "Enter" to adjust the settings by ◀ ▶ or ▲ ▼ key. To exit from adjusting the item, press "Enter" again.
- 4. If "to setting" word is shown in the setting, you can press "Enter" to enter another sub menu. Press "Menu" to close the sub menu after adjustment.
- 5. After adjusting the settings, press "Menu" to go back to the main menu.
- 6. To exit, press "Menu" again. The OSD will be closed.

# Image Adjustment

#### Contrast

The contrast controls the degree of difference between the lightest and darkest parts of the picture. Adjusting the contrast changes the amount of black and white in the image.

- ▶ Press the ▶ to increase the contrast.

#### Brightness

Adjust the brightness of the image.

- ▶ Press the ▶ to lighten the image.

#### Color Saturation

Adjust a video image from black and white to fully saturated color.

- ▶ Press the ◀ to decrease the amount of color in the image.
- ▶ Press the ▶ to increase the amount of color in the image.

### **Sharpness**

Adjust the sharpness of the image.

- ▶ Press the ◀ to decrease the sharpness.
- ▶ Press the ▶ to increase the sharpness.

#### Noise Reduction

Adjust the screen noise reduction level.



"Sharpness", "Noise Reduction" and "Color Saturation" functions are only supported under Video/S-Video/ Component signal sources.

#### Picture Mode

There are many factory presets optimized for various types of images. Use the  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to select the item.


# Replacing the lamp

The projector will detect the lamp life itself. It will show you a warning message.





Warning: To avoid burns, allow the projector to cool for at least 60 minutes before you replace the lamp! When you see this message, change the lamp as soon as possible. Make sure the projector has been cooled down for at least 60 minutes before changing the lamp.





Warning: Do not drop the lamp module or touch the glass parts. The glass parts may shatter and cause injury if it is dropped.

Warning: For continued safety replace with a lamp of the same type.

Caution: If the lamp should break, handle with care to avoid injury due to broken pieces and contact your sales representative for repair service.

#### Lamp Replacing Procedure:



- 2. Allow the projector to cool down at least 60 minutes.
- 3. Disconnect the power cord.
- 4. Use a screwdriver to remove the 4 screws from the cover. •
- 5. Push up and remove the lamp cover.
- 6. Remove the protection film. **2**
- 7. Loosen the 3 screws from the lamp module **3** and pull up the lamp bar. **4**
- 8. Pull out the lamp module by force. •
- 9. Install the new lamp module by reversing the previous steps. See the lamp's manual for instructions on resetting the lamp time.

#### **Used Lamps**

This projector's lamp contains trace amounts of environmentally harmful inorganic mercury. Be careful not to break used lamps, and dispose of them in accordance with local regulations or contact your sales representative.

# Cleaning the filter

We recommends cleaning the dust filter every three months; clean it more often if the projector is used in a dusty environment.



#### **Cleaning the Filter Procedure:**

- 1. Switch off the power to the projector by pressing the "Power".
- 2. Disconnect the power cord.
- 3. Remove the filter slowly and carefully. •
- 4. Clean or replace the filter. 2

To install the filter, reverse the previous steps.


